Bring back the 80's fashion and as many cans as you can!







The Superintendent of Schools will be relying upon the recommendations produced by a Redistricting Advisory Committee with regard to school boundaries in the Broadneck High School feeder zone. The Committee will consider adjustments to the school boundary lines for Arnold, Belvedere, Broadneck, Cape St. Claire and Windsor Farm elementary schools, and Magothy River and Severn River middle schools.

This meeting is a regularly scheduled meeting of the Redistricting Advisory Committee, the purpose of which is to discuss possible redistricting options. This meeting is open to the public and public input will be accepted.
