

On Track 4 Success (OT4S) is a data-driven early intervention strategy that helps ensure students at Meade Middle School receive the support they need to stay or get back on track for high school graduation. Developed with support from The Johns Hopkins University's School of Education, OT4S utilizes student data to examine proven predictors of dropping out: poor attendance, behavior and course performance (A,B,C's). When a student falls behind in any of these areas, a crossdisciplinary team of school staff, including a United Way Site Manager and Social Worker, meet to discuss the student's unique situation and implement appropriate interventions to support the student and their family.

## **Before & After-School Hours**

School Hours

Morning Drop Off: Please note that staff is not on duty to supervise students prior to 7:55a.m. We ask that parents not drop students off prior to 7:55a.m. as students must wait outdoors, unsupervised, regardless of weather conditions. The only exception is when prior arrangements have been made with a staff member for reasons such as early morning band or orchestra rehearsal.

**Afternoon Dismissal**: There are two separate bells for dismissal. Bus riders are dismissed at 3:00p.m. Car-riders and walkers are to remain in their 6<sup>th</sup> period class until the bell at 3:10. The staggered dismissal is a pre-cautionary measure that we take to make sure students exit the building in a safe manner. Parents of car riders and walkers, please emphasize the dismissal time with your children

**After-School Activities**: After-School Activities will be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays throughout the school year from 3:10-4:10pm, where a light dinner will be provided. At the conclusions of activities, activity buses will be available to transport bus riders home.

Please note that we no longer require students to turn in a signed permission slip to participate in Tutoring Tuesday and Thursdays. Please touch base with your student to ensure they know when they can stay after and to communicate that information with you on a regular basis. We encourage our students to be self-advocates and to regularly communicate with their teachers, reviewing progress reports to determine any extra support that may be required. #### **Uniforms and Uniform Policy**

Please help us stress the importance of following the Uniform policy by making sure that your child is coming to school dressed appropriately every day! Meade Middle believes uniforms can improve learning by reducing distractions,

sharpening focus on schoolwork and making the classroom a more scholarly environment, allowing students to perform better academically. In addition, please make sure that your child dresses in appropriate layers as temperatures vary from classroom to classroom.

**Tops**: Black, navy blue, gray or pastel blue long or short-sleeved polo (collared) style shirts with two or three buttons at the neck. Black Meade Middle M-Power polos may be worn daily. \*Students may wear Meade Middle School Spirit Wear, Club and M-Power shirts with the appropriate uniform bottoms on Fridays.

Pants: Khaki-style pants in black, navy blue, or a khaki color and must fit securely around the waist. Belts are recommended and must be plain black or brown. Jeans and sweatpants are not permitted.

Skirts/Shorts/Skorts: Must be black, navy blue, or khaki colored. The bottom of the garment must be no more than 3 inches from the center of the knee cap.

Additional Clothing: Solid navy blue or black V-neck sweaters, front button cardigans, sweatshirts or fleece jackets, and Meade Middle School sweatshirts may be worn over uniforms during the school day. College sweatshirts clearly stating the name of the college/university and that do not have hoods may also be worn.

Hoodies, coats, jackets, and hats must be kept in lockers.

All bookbags and string bags must be kept in students' main lockers during the school day. Students will not be permitted to carry their Gym or Dance uniforms in string bags .Only plastic grocery bags may be used to carry these items.

Purses should be 5x7 in size or smaller. All fanny packs should be worn around the waist.

<u>Consequences for not following the Uniform Policy:</u> Students that do not follow the policy will be addressed in homeroom.

1st Offense- Verbal Reminder to student

2<sup>nd</sup> Offense- Phone call home

3rd Offense-Lunch Detention

4<sup>th</sup> Offense- After-School Detention

 $5^{\text{th}}$  Offense- Administrative Consequence

#### **Meade Middle Tardy Policy**

Please reinforce the expectation that students must get to class on time so that your child does not miss out on instruction and avoids the following consequences for being late to class.

The teacher will document each time a student is Late to Class Unexcused and parents will be notified via Parent Connect phone call.

1<sup>st</sup> time Late to Class Unexcused (LU) – Teacher warning

2<sup>nd</sup> (LU)- Teacher warning

3<sup>rd</sup> (LU) – Teacher - specific consequence: conference after class, lunch detention, etc.

4<sup>th</sup> (LU) – Counselor and / or Student Advocate meeting with student

5<sup>th</sup> (LU) – Disciplinary referral written by teacher to Administration

Subsequent Tardiness = Additional referrals resulting in progressive consequences.

.\*This process is reset at the end of each marking period <u>if the student has 3 or fewer offenses.</u>

#### Cell Phones OFF and Out of Sight!

Cell phones are becoming an increasing distraction in school and teachers do not allow them to be used in class. Please help us reinforce the message that cell phones should be off and out of sight. Please also remind your child that if he/she has a cell phone, he/she must practice responsible behaviors. Students should not leave them unattended (such as out on their desk, charging against a wall, or laying on a locker room bench) and they should not be allowing others to use their phone. When we have students report their phone was broken or stolen, we often find that they left their phone unattended or gave it to another student to use. We rarely find stolen phones and we cannot force compensation for broken or stolen phones, which is why ask for them to be off and out of sight.

Finally, please help us keep a focus on learning by refraining from texting or calling your child on his/her cell phone during the day. If you have an emergency, we ask that you call the school and we can bring your child down to the office to speak to you.

## **Classroom Visitation Guidelines**

At Meade Middle School, we welcome parents and guardians and look forward to partnering with you to better support your children. We ask that you follow certain guidelines to help make your classroom visit a positive experience for both you and your child.

Please make arrangements with the teacher that you wish to visit at least 24 hours in advance. When you arrive at the school, please sign in at the Counseling Office to get a visitor's badge. As a security measure, we aske that parents wear their visitor's badge where it is easily visible and that you do not bring bags into the school.



Also, classroom visits are meant to allow parents/guardians to see their child and his/her teacher as they go through a regular class period. We ask that visitors not interact with their own child, other students or the teacher so as not to disrupt the learning of any students and disciplining of students by visitors is not allowed.

Please ensure that your cell phone is turned off or on silent when visiting the classroom. In order to protect the privacy of our students and staff, taking pictures and recording videos is strictly prohibited.

Please remember that teachers will NOT be available for an individual conference before, during or after instruction without a pre-arranged appointment. If you would like to speak to one of your child's teachers, please contact that teacher by email to make arrangements. If you would like to meet with more than one teacher, please contact your child's school Counselor to make an appointment.


## **Google Chrome Browser**



You may not give a lot of thought to the web browser that is used at home, but in AACPS Google Chrome is the "instructional browser" that teachers have students use when working on the Internet in the classroom. Most of our instructional websites function best in Chrome; some require it! If you do not have the Chrome browser installed on your child's computer, click here to download Chrome for Mac or PC.

To install on an iPad it can be accessed in the <u>App Store</u>. Android devices will come with Chrome.

## Signing into Chrome



To maximize the student's experience in Chrome and ensure that they can access the same tools their classroom teachers have them use, we recommend they sign into Chrome.

Follow <u>these directions</u> to have your child sign into Chrome to gain access to their bookmarks and extensions.

Have more than one child in AACPS? Do your children share a computer at home? Perhaps they even share the computer with you! Watch this 10 minute <a href="video">video</a> to find out how all Google users in your household can be signed into Chrome simultaneously so everyone has access to only their own online resources.

## ClassLink at home



When logged onto computers and Chromebooks in AACPS, students have an online homepage called Classlink. The Classlink dashboard contains the links to the websites and online textbooks that students use frequently in class so they don't have to waste instructional time conducting searches or typing in web addresses. Classlink is also a "single sign on service" that allows students to get into their AACPS online accounts without having to remember multiple logins or to waste time repeatedly typing in usernames and passwords.

Follow <u>these directions</u> for how your child can access their ClassLink from home.

## **Online Textbooks**



Links to access the online textbooks that students use in various classes are all available from the ClassLink homepage. If students follow the directions above to use Chrome, sign into Chrome, and access ClassLink, they can click and enter into any of their online textbooks from the Classlink page. This includes McGraw Hill, StemScopes and TCi.

## Microsoft OneDrive & Office 365



All AACPS staff and students have a Microsoft OneDrive & Office 365 account. Your child's login to this account is <a href="mailto:studentid#@aacps.org">studentid#@aacps.org</a>, and the same password they use to logon to AACPS computers. This account includes a cloud drive with 1 Terabyte of storage for digital folders and files. It also includes a suite of productivity tools that include Microsoft Word, PowerPoint and Excel online.


Along with the online tools, families in AACPS can install Microsoft Office Pro Plus on up to 5 computers to have access to Office at home. Follow <a href="these-blue">these directions</a> to install.



All AACPS staff and students have a Google for Education account. Your child's login to this account is <a href="mailto:studentid#@aacps.org">studentid#@aacps.org</a>, and the same password they use to logon to AACPS computers. This account includes a cloud drive of unlimited storage for digital folders and files. It also includes a suite of productivity tools that include Google Docs, Slides, Drawings and more. *Please note:* students DO NOT have Gmail accounts or any email with AACPS.

Our Google for Education accounts also include access to Google Classroom. If your child's teacher has assigned digital homework, they can access it through Google Classroom, and/or their Google Drive account.

## Google Classroom



Google Classroom is a paperless, digital class platform for teachers to share resources, announcements, assignments and assessments with students. Students can access, complete, and turn in their assignments and assessments. Teachers can grade, share feedback and return those assignments and student scores, without a piece of paper every changing hands. As our teachers work to reduce paper use, Google Classroom is gaining popularity. It is quite likely that at least one of your child's teachers is sharing resources through Google Classroom.

Most AACPS schools have available to families a **What's Happening page** on Blackboard for sharing important information (syllabi, field trip permission forms, calendar of events, etc). If your school uses this resource, they will send home information with specific login instructions for their site. For ongoing questions about a school's What's Happening page, please check your school's website, or call the school.

## Doing Research



AACPS has a subscription to a variety of professional online databases that students can use in class and at home to conduct research for class assignments. Using these resources will alleviate the frustrations that students and their parents can experience when endless Internet searches fail to yield helpful or useful results.

The School's Media Specialist can share the login for the databases that students would need to use when accessing these resources from outside of school.

OR

Students can access all of their school's databases if they sign into MackinVIA. Go to <a href="https://www.mackinvia.com/">https://www.mackinvia.com/</a> and login with their Student ID number and the last 4 digits of their Student ID as their password.

## Online subscriptions



Looking for quality instructional platforms your child can access online from home? These applications are accessible through Classlink:

<u>Discovery Education</u> - AACPS has a subscription to DE where students can access videos, audio files, images and articles that can all be incorporated into other projects.

Google Earth - Google Earth is free and online! Students can travel the world by simply typing in where they would like to go. Students can search for street addresses, landmarks, countries, continents, oceans and more.

The Math Learning Center- The Math Learning Center has free digital math manipulatives including geoboards, number frames, pattern shapes and more.

<u>Scratch</u> and <u>code.org</u> - students learn to code in online platforms, beginning with block coding and advancing into text-based coding.

Typing Club - Elementary students in AACPS have access to Typing Club to help them learn to type faster, more efficiently, and with more accuracy.

WeVideo - AACPS has a district license for the online video recording and editing platform. Students can record video or audio files, add narration and still images and perform advanced video editing to make a polished final project.

<u>Wixie</u> - elementary and middle school students in AACPS have accounts for Wixie. Wixie is an online whiteboard program where students can write, type, paint pictures and tell stories. They can even record audio narration for their slides.

## Software to download



Want to maximize access to school platforms from home? AACPS has district licences for the following software programs that allow students and staff to install and use from home:

<u>SMART Notebook</u> - Notebook is a whiteboard program that allows users to make interactive presentations. If installed at home, staff and students can open, edit and create Notebook files. **Please note:** AACPS is currently using version 17.1.1, plans to upgrade to version 19 in October 2019. To ensure full compatibility between home and school, we recommend installing the same version at home.

<u>Microsoft Office Pro Plus</u> - families in AACPS can install Office Pro Plus on up to 5 computers to have access to Office at home.
