What are Intramurals?

Intramurals is an extracurricular activity that offers students the opportunity to participate in sports and fitness activities.

Who can participate in intramurals?

All students are welcome to enjoy the SMS intramurals program! It is open to all levels of ability, and students can choose which activities they would like to participate in based on the offerings.

Intramurals do not make "cuts" like many sports teams, and only a positive attitude and strong display of sportsmanship is allowed. Any student who is not meeting PE class expectations, failing to follow the school code of conduct, or if intramurals is hindering a student's academic success they may be put on probation or permanently dismissed from the intramurals program. This is at the discretion of the SMS PE teachers and SMS administration.

When do intramurals happen?

The SMS intramurals program has many different options to get involved! <u>Morning workouts</u> are offered on Tuesday mornings before school at 8:00am. Students who would like to come before school must have a ride and get dropped off in front of the school by the PE locker rooms at 8am. No student should be left at the school until the PE teacher has arrived.

<u>After School Intramurals</u> happen after school on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:55 - 4:45pm.

How do intramurals work?

A monthly schedule of sports and activity offerings will be posted on the PE bulletin board outside of the locker rooms. The offerings will also be announced on the school morning announcements.

When you notice an activity that you would like to stay for, talk to your parents and make arrangements ahead of time to come. Do not wait until the last minute to ask your parents for permission to stay.

You can come as often or as little as you would like based on what works for you. Unlike sports teams where you have to make a commitment, intramurals allow the flexibility for students to get involved on an individual basis.

Pay attention to the morning announcements for any changes to the schedule such as cancellations or choice offering changes. You can always ask a PE teacher if you are unsure.
