PARENT PORTAL

Anne Arundel County Public Schools can provide you with access to your child's attendance, assignments, and grades via the PowerSchool Student/Parent Portal.

To access the Parent Portal, you will need to follow these steps:

- 1. Open your web browser and navigate to the Anne Arundel County Public Schools website (www.aacps.org) and click the Student/Parent Portal icon in the white banner space near the top of the page.
- 2. Click the PowerSchool Student and Parent Sign In button.
- 3. Click the Create Account button. Please note that you only need to create one Parent Portal account and link all your AACPS students in grades K through 12.

For step-by-step instructions for creating an account or linking your children, access the Establishing a Parent Portal Account document on the Student/Parent Portal Homepage.

- **You will need the following information to establish your Parent Portal account:
- Your Access ID for your child is your child's AACPS student identification number (the 6-digit code they use to login to the computer) and a lowercase letter p. Example: 123456p
- Your Access Password (Please contact school office for this information)

If you encounter any issues with the creation of your Parent Portal account or with linking your child to the account, please contact the school directly or email parentportal@aacps.org.

DISMISSAL



"My kid went where with whom?!" So that we NEVER have that scenario, we ALWAYS need a signed note from the parent/guardian when someone else is to pick up a student. Listing someone on an emergency card does not give them free access to pick up your student whenever. Without a note, we have no idea if you are aware of this early dismissal. So what IS the purpose of additional names on an emergency card?! Here is the inside scoop! The ONLY purpose for listing additional names on the emergency cards is if your student is sick or school closes unexpectedly (ie, loss of power/water, etc) and we are UNABLE to get in touch with you, who may we contact to pick up your student? It's that simple. With a note, we know that you know!



What is SAIL?

SAIL is your key to the world of information and learning tools available from the Anne Arundel County Public Library.

It is a special library account, which you can use to borrow books, magazines, journals, online encyclopedias, educational DVDs and other resources from the Anne Arundel County Public Library. It also lets you use premium resources like language learning or live homework help.

Check out up to ten items with no fines, but you still need to return the books on time!

How does it work?

SAIL works just like a regular library card, only there's no plastic card to keep track of.

Your SAIL number is made up of a prefix code and your student number.

If you are looking for some great books for the readers in your home, our county librarv system has some fantastic resources for you! All AACPS students have SAIL accounts that allow them to access materials from the Anne Arundel County Public library with their Student ID number. We just learned that students can even download digital books and AUDIO books with this account. It is as simple as going to the library website at aacpl.net and using the prefix below along with your student's ID number. Learn more about SAIL (Student Access to Improved Learning) accounts.

Important – your SAIL number has a six-digit PIN, which is set to the digits in your birthday. For example, if your birthday is 10/18/2008, your PIN is 101808.

Your SAIL number works just like a library card. Anytime the Library's website asks for your library card number, just enter your SAIL number. You can also use any of the library's eResources to access ebooks, audiobooks, stream videos, etc. with your SAIL number and PIN. BALLROOM DANCING

MCAP ASSESSMENT REMINDERS

1.Please mark your calendar and strive to have your child in school on testing days. It is important that students are present on testing days. - 2.Please remind your child to fully charge his/her Chromebook for testing.
- 3.Students will need to wear headphones during the English Language Arts testing for MCAP. While we do have headphones here at school, it is helpful and more sanitary for the students to have their own personal set. Please check with your child to see that he/she has a pair of working headphones at school. If a student does not have a pair, we will be happy to provide them with a pair. OFFICE NEWS

OUT-OF-AREA TRANSFERS

Bodkin is currently a closed school so we are unable to approve new Out-of-Area requests. Continuation requests should be submitted to Mrs. Myers **between March 1 and May 1**. After May 1, they must be sent directly to Central Office with a valid reason for being late. An Out-of-Area transfer is a request for a student residing in Anne Arundel County to attend a school within the county other than the assigned boundary school (often referred to as a student's home school). If a child already attends Bodkin as an Out-of-Area approved student, the application must be completed and submitted each school year. The continuation of a previous year's out-of-area is not automatic, and the application must be submitted to the school during the out-of-area application window. KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION FOR 2023–2024 SCHOOL YEAR

Registration is for incoming kindergarten students who will be five years old by September 1, 2023. The Registration Portal opens for Kindergarten beginning April 12 online here: https://www.aacps.org/Enrollment. Required documents for registration are, birth certificate, immunization records, and two proofs of residency. Register right away! Please call Bodkin with questions or if you need assistance. Please encourage your neighbors and friends with 5 year olds to register as soon as possible.





FULL DAY FOUR-YEAR-OLD PRE-K

Pre-K applications will begin on May 2, 2023. **Students must live in the Bodkin school zone**. Children must be 4 years old on or by September 1, 2023. Public Pre-Kindergarten programs in Maryland are designed to improve the school readiness of children who are economically disadvantaged or homeless (documents are required). If seats remain, schools may enroll students with other readiness needs. The following documents are required when applying for a child to attend Four-Year-Old Prekindergarten and must be uploaded along with the completed online application:

-Parent or guardian's ID

-Student's original birth certificate, birth registration or birth record

-A copy of the student's immunization record

-Two proofs of residency (rental agreement or mortgage statement and a current utility bill);

-Income documents;

-custody order (if applicable).

Everyone applying for Prekindergarten must provide income eligibility verification by submitting **one** of the following:

- -Federal Income Tax Return (1040 statement) along with documentation related to other sources of income such as child support and/or rental income.
- -Current award letter for Temporary Cash Assistance or Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.

-Proof of unemployment benefits

All families must ALSO submit one month of consecutive pay stubs


The donation bin is located to the left of the school (when looking at the school) near the track. It's an easy stop when leaving the parking lot. Can we collect the most in April?
