


Our Chorus Concert was fantastic! The students sang holiday favorites along with some new tunes.

CAR RIDER LINE

Please remember to keep the morning car rider line moving. If you prefer to get out with your child, feel free to park and walk your child over to the entrance. In case you were not aware, our afternoon car rider line is behind Bodkin in the CBMS lower lot. If someone else will be picking up your child (grandparents, aunt/uncle, etc.), please let them know where the car rider line is. We will also need a note any time someone other than the parent/guardian is picking up your child. Thank you for your cooperation in keeping Bodkin's students safe.

OLC PARKING LOT

We appreciate the kindness of Our Lady of the Chesapeake church for allowing parents to use their parking lot if it is not already in use. However, please only park in the designated spots and not in their grass. Thank you for understanding.

RECESS

Please remember that students will have outdoor recess if the temperature is 32 degrees or above. Coats, hats, and gloves are recommended on the extra cold days.



NO PARKING IN FIRE LANE AT ANY TIME

Parking in designated fire lanes and/or bus loops is prohibited. This prohibition extends to staff, students, visitors, spectators at athletic events, day care vans, and after school activity vans such as karate centers, clubs, etc. Any vehicle parked in a fire lane or obstructing a fire hydrant must be moved to an authorized parking space.

Maryland Motor Vehicle Law §21-101.1(b)2,3 states,

A person may not drive a motor vehicle in violation of any provision of this title on any property that is owned by or under the control of this State or any of its political subdivisions, county boards of education, or community colleges and that is open to vehicular traffic and used by the public in general. Any person who violates any provision of this subsection is in violation of the law to the same extent and is subject to the same penalty as if the motor vehicle were driven on a highway.

As you know, in a critical emergency, the loss of every minute caused by vehicles blocking fire and police department access can become critical.

VIRTUAL SNOW DAY INFORMATION

With the potential of upcoming inclement weather, here is some information regarding virtual snow days.

- Students are reminded to always take devices home and keep them charged
- Virtual asynchronous lessons are created for students and will be posted to Brightspace
- With regard to communications, please know the following:
- If there is no message, everything is on time.
- A Code Red means all schools and offices are closed and there is no virtual instruction
- A two-hour delay means schools open two hours later than normal
- A call for virtual instruction means all buildings are closed but virtual instruction will proceed in one of the following manners

-SCHOOLS CLOSED, VIRTUAL SYNCHRONOUS LEARNING

Students will engage in real-time virtual instruction with their teachers. Schools will begin instruction at 9 or 9:15 a.m., as listed on schedules that can be found at <u>www.aacps.org/studentschedules</u>. Students must log in and participate in classes to be counted present. Students will receive a subsequent message following the countywide message sent by Communications with more specific instructions from their school. -SCHOOLS CLOSED, VIRTUAL ASYNCHRONOUS LEARNING

Students will independently engage in posted virtual lessons at a time of their choosing. Students should access lessons in their Brightspace accounts and must log in by 2 p.m. to be counted present for the day.

AACPS VIRTUAL BOOK CLUB

Families with students in Grades 3-5 are invited to request enrollment in a four-session Virtual Book Club hosted January 30 through February 27, 2023. If requests exceed 45 students per school, lottery selection will determine enrollment for available spaces. Student selection and meeting details will be communicated via email on Friday, January 13, 2023. Selected students will be assigned to a virtual meeting session hosted at 6:00-6:45PM or 7:00-7:45PM on the following dates: January 30, February 6, February 13, and February 27. All meetings will be hosted via Google Meet, links for the meetings will be communicated by email by January 13, 2023. There is no cost to participate in this program.

What's Going On?

23-24 SCHOOL YEAR CALENDAR



The Board of Education followed the recommendations of the school system's Calendar Committee, adopting a 2023-2024 school year calendar that calls for classes to begin for students on Monday, August 28, 2023, and end on Thursday, June 13, 2024. The calendar maintains the holiday closings contained in the current school year calendar as well as a three-day Thanksgiving break and the weeklong Easter/Spring break. It also contains closings for Yom Kippur and Eid al-Fitr and builds in three days to be used in the case of inclement weather. The calendar also contains four two-hour early dismissals to allow for staff to engage in professional development related to equity and two two-hour early dismissals at the end of each of the four marking periods. The Board also agreed to begin developing calendars two years in advance to afford more time for families to plan, though it did not set a date to begin doing so. CLOTHING TO CASH





Has your child considered the AVID program for Middle School?

January is quickly approaching and before you know it, your child will be selecting their courses for Chesapeake Bay Middle School! At CMBS we offer AVID, a program designed to provide academic instruction and support to students in the "middle to upper middle" to prepare them for eligibility to four-year colleges and universities. BODKIN HELPING OLC WINTER RELIEF

Bodkin students are invited to take part in a volunteer opportunity to provide bagged lunches for homeless individuals. Once again, as a part of the Winter Relief Shelter Program in Anne Arundel County, shelter will be made available to homeless individuals by Our Lady of the Chesapeake Church during the week of January 2-8, 2023.Our school community is excited to provide lunches for individuals staying at the shelter each day of their stay. Students and staff will take part in meaningful fun and shared kindness by collecting lunch items, decorating bags, making cards, making sandwiches, and volunteering. We want each child to have a part in the lunch preparation. A walk will be organized (by grade) to the church to assemble the lunches during the school day and to tour the temporary shelter. 
