What's Going On?

MEAL PRICES

The Board of Education of Anne Arundel County unanimously approved a plan to leave school meal prices at the same level as they have been for the last eight years in which students have had to pay for meals. Under the approved plan, full-price breakfast at all levels for the 2023-24 school year would remain at \$1.50, elementary school lunches would cost \$2.75, and secondary school lunches would cost \$3.00. The price of milk would remain at \$.55. Reduced-price breakfast and meal prices at all levels would also remain unchanged.





FROM THE HEALTH ROOM



The end of the school year is approaching. According to Anne Arundel County Public Schools Medication Guidelines, all medications must be picked up by the end of the school year or the medication will be discarded. If medications are not picked up by an adult by 1:30pm on the last day of school at Bodkin Elementary, they will be discarded according to guidelines. Please make arrangements with the health room staff to pick up your child's medication. Medication can be picked up anytime between now and the last day of school on June 13. Thank you!

As a reminder, **5th graders** moving to middle school will need updated immunizations. All 5th grade students are required to receive a Tetanus/Diptherial/Acellular Pertussis (Tdap) immunization and a meningococcal (MCV4) vaccine before entering middle school. All **Pre-K** students are required to receive their 2nd Varicella and Measles, Mumps and Rubella immunizations before entering Kindergarten in the fall.
