



# **HEALTH ROOM**



The end of the school year is approaching. According to Anne Arundel County Public Schools Medication Guidelines, all medications must be picked up by the end of the school year or the medication will be discarded. If medications are not picked up by an adult by 1:30pm on the last day of school at Bodkin Elementary, they will be discarded according to guidelines. Please make arrangements with the health room staff to pick up your child's medication. Medication can be picked up anytime between now and the last day of school on June 11. Thank you!

As a reminder, **5th graders** moving to middle school will need updated immunizations. All 5th grade students are required to receive a Tetanus/Diptherial/Acellular Pertussis (Tdap) immunization and a meningococcal (MCV4) vaccine before entering middle school. All Pre-K students are required to receive their 2nd Varicella and Measles, Mumps and Rubella immunizations before entering Kindergarten in the fall.





#### KINDERGARTEN & PRE-K FOUR REGISTRATION

Registration is for incoming kindergarten students who will be five years old by September 1, 2024. The online Registration Portal is open now for incoming Kindergarten students. Required documents for registration are: birth certificate, immunization records, and two proofs of residency. Please call Bodkin with questions or if you need assistance.

Pre-K Four applications will be starting on May 7. Those students will need to be four years old by September 1, 2024. For more information, see below or visit the <u>AACPS</u> <u>Early Childhood site</u>.

Students currently enrolled in PK3 are not automatically eligible for PK4. Families must apply for the 24-25 school year under the new guidelines.

Enrollment is based on the time/date stamp of the application and the applicant's priority.

Private providers will require information on the parent's or guardian's place of employment.

Once documents are reviewed and approved, your student will be officially enrolled in prek.


