Hello Central Elementary School Families-

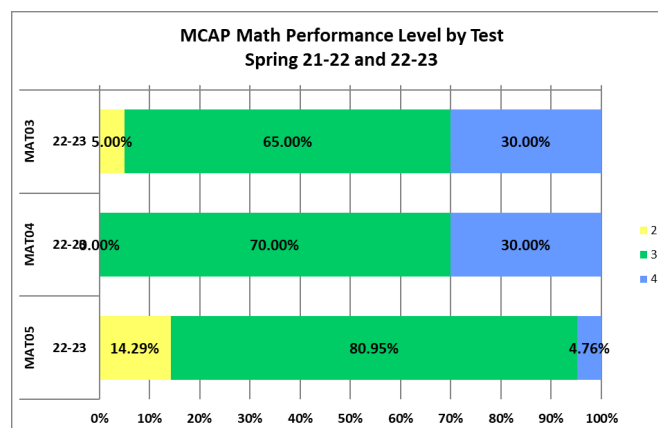
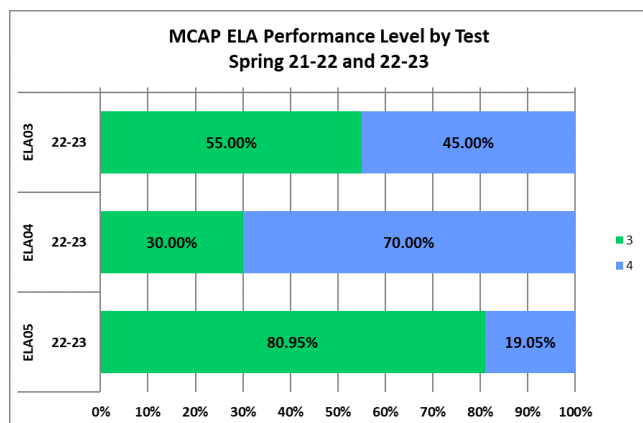
iReady Expectations

Advanced Learning at Central Elementary

The Central Elementary Advanced Learner Programs Committee is focused on supporting gifted and advanced learners through ongoing data analysis to ensure students are working at their full potential. The data charts below show how GT students performed on ELA and Math MCAP in the spring of 2023. All GT students scored at either the proficient learner level or distinguished learner level on ELA MCAP. In Math, five percent of 2022-2023 3rd Grade GT learners (current 4th Grade) scored at the developing learner level- all others were proficient or distinguished. Our School Improvement goal is to increase the number of students who score proficient or better on MCAP in 2024. Our school Leadership, School Improvement, and ALPs teams have drilled down to identify students who are on the cusp of proficiency. We are working collaboratively to support these students through targeted instruction.

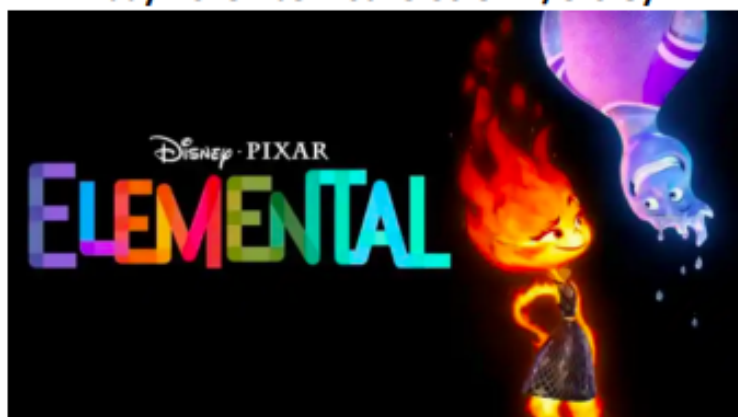
