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Good Afternoon Crofton Meadows Elementary Families!

Here is your Weekly Wrap Up for the week ending Friday, April 10, 2020.

(School System Shutdown Edition!)

What's Happening - As we finish our fourth week of school closure, I hope this newsletter finds you and your family safe and healthy. As it has been since the beginning of this crisis, our priority is the health and safety of our entire CMES community. Please know that we are here to help in anyway we can.

During the past week, teachers have been preparing report cards for the 3rd making period and providing online content for the student through the use of Google classroom. Report cards will be mailed directly from the Board of Education (similar to the way they do at the end of a school year) starting the week of April 20, 2020. We will also be emailing Principal Honor Roll and Honor Roll certificates to those students that have earned these awards.

The fourth marking period started for the students this past week. The teachers posted lessons and assignments in their Google classrooms. AACPS has tried very hard to make eLearning as flexible as possible considering all the demands that are on students and families at this time. Here is what to expect with eLearning:

- Teachers have identified an instructional time (in the morning) and Office Hours (in the afternoon) and posted these times on in their Google classroom. These are times where the teacher will be available to support instruction or to "meet" with individual students or small groups of students to support their learning.
- 2) Teachers are posting two required lessons in their Google classroom each "school day". These lessons are designed to take no longer than 1.5 hours including any independent work the student may need to complete. Students should complete these assignments <u>at their convenience</u>. It does not have to be at a specific time or day, but the assignments are required.
- 3) Teachers will follow an "A-Day/B-Day schedule. On an "A-Day" teachers will post a Language Arts lesson and a Science lesson. On a "B-Day" teachers will post a math lesson and a Social Studies lesson.

- 4) Cultural Arts activities are posted on the Cultural Arts Google classroom for students to access during the week.
- 5) Starting this coming week, one assignment in each of the fourth subjects listed above will be taken for a grade. The graded assignment will be identified by the teacher.
- 6) Teachers <u>may</u> also have additional opportunities posted in their Google classroom such as a Community Building Circle time, read alouds, or additional learning sessions. All these are <u>OPTIONAL</u> for students to do. We do not want to overwhelm students or families, so these assignments are available if a student wanted to do additional learning. These are not required and are not graded.
- 7) Any lesson or learning opportunity that a teacher conducts "live" will be recorded and posted on their Google classroom so other students can view it at their convenience.
- 8) Teachers will provide feedback on the required lessons.
- 9) Teachers will reach out to students and families if a student has not logged into their Google classroom in over a week. This is a way to make sure the students are still connected and are not having accessibility difficulties.

So, **the bottom line** is: Students are expected to complete only the require lessons posted in their teacher's Google classroom. One lesson in each subject will have a graded activity (identified by the teacher) that is collected for the fourth marking period grades. Students can log into the Google classroom and completed the required assignments at their convenience (during the teacher's instructional time, or in the evening or on the weekend.) There is no requirement that the student has to be logged into the Google classroom at a specific time.

Students and families need to understand that there are additional opportunities posted in their teacher's Google classroom for students that want to engage in these activities. Do not get overwhelmed with these activities as they are <u>optional</u>. Student can do them if they want.

If at any time, a student or family has difficulty with eLearning, please reach out to the classroom teacher. If the teacher cannot provide the appropriate assistance, she/he will notify the appropriate staff member to assist the student or family. Please remember, we are here to help.

Accessibility to the Google Classroom - We are aware that some students still don't have access to the internet or the google classroom. The CMES staff have reached out to all students that teachers have identified as students that have not connected to their Google classrooms with information about getting connected. (Please check your email or voicemail.) If you do not have access or have not been able to connect with your teacher's Google classroom AND have not heard from someone from the school, please email me at jtrumbule@aacps.org. AACPS has decided that eLearning is the way that the curriculum for the fourth marking periods will be made available to the students, so all students must be able to get online.

We are working hard to minimize the "bumps in the road" as we move forward. Please feel free to reach out to me (jtrumbule@aacps.org) or Mrs. Morton (kmorton@aacps.org) or your student's classroom teacher, if you have any questions.

CMES Office - Please remember that the school office is closed and there is nobody there to answer the phones.

When using eBooks, the Capstone and Mackin books can be accessed without a user name and password. Capstone is Ms. Radisi's preferred platform as the books are narrated with a human voice rather than a computer-generated voice.
