Here is your Weekly Wrap Up for the week ending Friday, October 25, 2019.

What's Happening - The highlight of this week was UNITY Day! The entire school system celebrated Unity Day by wearing orange to show kindness and stomp out bullying. Students made posters, wrote sticky notes to encourage kindness, and created hallway displays to spread the message that kindness lives here and bullying is not acceptable. However, the most impressive display of kindness and antibullying was the actions of the students with each other and with the staff. It was wonderful to see so may caring and random acts of kindness throughout the building. We encourage everyone to keep the kind and inclusive spirit going!

We also had an evacuation drill (fire drill) today. The drill was a little different from our regular evacuation drills. As part of AACPS emergency preparedness plans, today's drill required us to evacuate the building when some students were in the cafeteria and where one exit was blocked. The students and staff reacted to these different circumstances in an awesome fashion. Students and staff were able to exit in an orderly and timely manner. The entire drill took less than 10 minutes and students and staff returned to their day when the drill was concluded.

The end of the first marking period is quickly approaching. Students should check with their teachers to ensure all graded work for this marking period is completed and turn in. The marking period ends on November 7, 2019.

New Policy on Snacks from the Cafeteria – In an effort to promote healthy eating habits, the school cafeteria will be limiting student purchases of snacks such as ice cream and cookies to one item per day, when snacks are available. Currently students are allowed to purchase as many snacks as they want as long as there is money on their account. That meant some students were eating three ice creams for their lunch and nothing else. If parents would like to allow their student to purchase multiple snacks a day, please let the school know and we will work with the cafeteria manager to make that happen. Otherwise, snack purchases will be limited to one item when snacks are sold, starting Monday, October 7th.
