Here is your Weekly Wrap Up for the week ending Friday, November 22, 2019.

What's Happening - This week was exceptionally busy at Crofton Meadows. On Monday, the Crofton Chamber of Commerce paid the third grade class their annual visit bringing each student a personal dictionary. The members spend a few minutes in each class passing out the dictionaries and helping the students realize the dictionaries were more than a book of words, they actually were filled with a lot of other interesting information.

The students were also treated to an assembly on reading. The students were very excited about how the characters came "alive" with lights. Thanks to Mrs. Colleen Pitts and the PTO for sponsoring this event.

On Thursday evening, the faculty and staff of Crofton Meadows hosted our annual Reading Night. About 150 students and families participated in reading games and activities, listened to an author/illustrator, and read books by the "fire". Thanks to Mrs. Shrader and her Reading Team for there hard work in creating a super fun night for the students to enjoy!

Today students in grades 1 - 5 brought home their report cards for the first marking period. This is a time for the students to reflect on their progress so far this school year and to plan for improvement and success during the second marking period. Kindergarten students brought home the results of the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment.

Important Message for the School Administration - It has come to our attention that several students in the intermediate grades are involved in large group texting chain. This activity seems to be happening outside of school, but the effects are starting to trickle into the school building and the classrooms. Teachers have overheard several conversations among students about topics that are discussed in the groups (i.e. dating, boyfriends and girlfriends). Additionally, the teachers have noticed students complaining of being tired because they were up late at night sending and receiving text messages. Of particular concern, many members of the chat group are unknown to the group or school officials. We now have students accusing others of "turning them in" to the teachers. This is cyberbullying and will not be tolerated! Students that are found to be bullying others, either through text

messages, group chat, or in person will face disciplinary action in accordance with the student code of conduct. We are asking parents to be aware of their student's texting habits and internet safety. We also ask that parents speak with their student about the consequences for participating in these activities. Thank you in advance for addressing these concerns with your student.

Family Vacations – It's beginning to be that time of year where parents start making requests of teachers to prepare work for their students who are going to miss school due to a family vacation. A list of lawful causes of absences can be found on page 15 of the 2019 – 2020 Parent Handbook. Missing school for vacation is not on the list of lawful reasons for absence from school. It is very difficult for teachers to prepare work for students in advance and typically very little of this work comes back to the teacher when the student returns. Student work will be collected during absences and provided the student to make up upon their return. Work that is not made up will be counted as missing assignments and factored into the student's grades. Although it is a family decision when vacations are planned, it is best practice for the student's academic success if vacations are scheduled during the time when the school system is closed on a holiday break.

Class Fees - If you have not paid your student's class fee from the beginning of the school year, please consider doing this as soon as possible. Navigate to your student's teacher/grade to find the class fee.
