

Our students settled into a routine quite easily, enabling our teachers to jump into building relationships and teaching content. It feels great to have this school year in full-swing. By this point, all students have had their first Arts & Humanities class of the school year. This course is part of the Triple E program and serves as a fifth day of Cultural Arts for students. This class uses dance, music, theater, and visual art to explore problems. Also new this year is the Reveal Math program. Parents received information on an upcoming parent session to learn about the components of this new math program. We encourage parents to stay involved in your child's academics. Ensure you have an active Parent Portal account, have logged into your child's iReady account (grades 1-5) to monitor progress, and have completed their emergency card information for this school year.

Last month, we welcomed Chris in the Classroom to our school to talk with students and parents about what it means to be resilient and how to solve conflict with others. While his concepts were basic, they reminded us that just saying "be kind" or "stay away from them" doesn't always resolve the issues kids encounter with peers. We will continue to teach these concepts through our Second Step curriculum and support our students during times like recess. #### STUDENT **ATTENDANCE**

Consistent attendance is critical to the academic success of all students. Our school monitors student attendance data monthly. The following has been set up as a guide for parents:

School hours: 8:00am-2:25pm

Students will be marked tardy if they arrive between 8:01am—11:20am.

Students will be marked with an early dismissal if they leave school between 11:21am-2:25pm.

Students must be in school at least 40 minutes in order to be marked present for a half day.

Notification is needed for each absence. For 5 or more consecutive absences a doctor note is needed.

#### STUDENT **ILLNESS**

As we move into the months with increased illness, we ask families to remain vigilant in keeping students home when they are sick. General rules include staying home for 24 hours after vomiting or 24 hours fever free without medication. For Covid positive cases, we follow the CDC guidelines which require a 5-day isolation followed by five days of recommended masking. THANK YOU!!!
