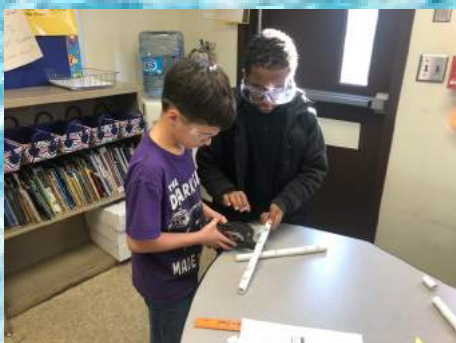
CLUB OF THE MONTH

"Don't litter and recycle more." - Jackeline M.

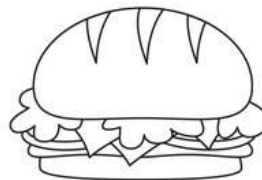
"Pick up trash if you see it!" - Declen M.
