It is a MAY zing we are into May already! This is an exciting time in the school year! There are many experiences students will have such as going on a field trip, school assemblies and field day! I hope your family will participate in our Nursey Rhyme at Home Reading Program. The skill of rhyming is so important in the initial development of phonemic awareness as well as recognizing word patterns. It is a predictor of later reading development.

It is important you register or request enrollment for your child for school next year. If you are having difficulty with online registration, please sign up to attend our last Chat n' Chew registration support on May 7th. A flyer went home Monday with more information. Registration is currently open for those registering for Kindergarten. Support will be from 9:15-10, and PK3/4 support will be from 12:30-1:15. Pre-K 3 and Pre-K 4 enrollment applications can begin to be submitted at noon on May 7th for any child turning 3 or 4 as of September 1, 2024. Registration is centralized through the county and done online. Students need to meet the eligibility requirements as noted on the county websitewww.aacps.org/earlychildhood . Any PK3 family can also complete a request for alternative placement to request that your child remain at Ferndale for PK4.

I'm excited to share this year our school received Maryland State Accreditation for our Pre-Kindergarten program. In addition, we were recertified as a Maryland Green School. We were recognized for our exemplary work in environmental education addressing environmental literacy with energy, water and waste conservation; promoting environmental literacy as well as structures for outdoor learning to name a few.

There is still a lot of learning and opportunities ahead of us this year. In these last few weeks, we will continue to reinforce our school values of acting responsibly, being safe, and caring for ourselves, others and the world around us. It is important all students come ready to learn each day. We are looking forward to our end of the year Celebration of Learning. More information will be coming home as we get closer to June.

Much appreciation to those who have been generously sending in snacks and goodies for the staff during Teacher/Staff appreciation week. The overwhelming amount of generosity will be appreciated by all. This will be our last big newsletter for the school year. As we move into June, any updates on events will go home through email, text or flyers. We love our Ferndale community and have appreciated all your support this school year. 

<u>To register for Pre-Kindergarten</u> your child must be 3 years old or 4 years old on or by September 1, <u>2024</u>

<u>Please go to aacps.org and look for</u> <u>enrollments; Appointments are</u> <u>required before walking into the</u> <u>office.</u>

<u>Important Visitor</u> <u>Information</u>

For the safety and security of our students and staff, we ask that <u>all</u> Visitors show a photo ID and check- in with the main office.

We also ask that all visitors call or reach out to the teacher or the main office when picking up your student for early dismissal.

News from the Health Room

May is a very exciting time in our school! The warmer weather has allowed the students to have more frequent outdoor recess, classes have been taking advantage of the outdoor learning space, and students are enjoying outdoor activities at home. This month we appropriately celebrate Skin Cancer Prevention Month! With students and families spending more time outside, here are some helpful tips on making sure everyone stays safe while enjoying the wonderful weather:

- Skin cancer will affect 1 in 5 Americans at some point in their lifetime, but there are ways to help decrease your risk of developing it!
- Protect your skin by seeking shade frequently, wearing sun protective clothing and regularly applying sunscreen.
- The type of sunscreen you use matters! To be best protected, choose a sunscreen with a label that says it has an SPF of 30 or higher, is water-resistant and provides broad-spectrum coverage.
- Apply sunscreen before going outdoors! Sunscreen takes at least 15 minutes to absorb into your skin and start protecting you.
- Make sure to apply sunscreen to all exposed skin, including the neck, ears, nose and feet. These areas are often forgotten, but easily burn when exposed to sun.
- Reapply sunscreen every two hours when outside and immediately after swimming or sweating. Even waterresistant sunscreens need to be reapplied after 40 to 80 minutes of exposure to water or sweat!
- Remember to protect your skin anytime you're outside! The sun's harmful UV rays can burn you during all types of weather, including cloudy days and during winter. Keep your skin safe at all times!

Anne Arundel County policy allows students to bring sunscreen to school, but states that students must be able to apply the sunscreen themselves without staff aid. For any questions about sunscreen use in school, please contact us in the health room. For more information on sun safety and skin cancer prevention tips, visit spotskincancer.org and speak to your doctor. Have a safe and healthy spring!

News from the Health Room

<u>Health Room Reminder</u>

All medications must be picked up by:

June 13 at 1:30 pm

All medications left after this time will be discarded.

June is finally here! As sad as we are to see our students go, we are excited for summer. This month we celebrate National Safety Month, which is a great time to talk about summer safety with your family!

Never leave infants, children, or pets in parked cars, even with the windows cracked open. The temperature in parked cars rise quickly to dangerous levels and could result in serious illness or death. Plan outdoor activities for the morning and evening hours. Avoid being outside for prolonged time during midday to avoid the highest temperatures. Stay hydrated!

Keep a water bottle with you when doing outdoor activities or running errands. Hydration is very important in avoiding heat-related illnesses.

Cover up as much skin as possible and frequently apply sunscreen to avoid sunburn, prevent fluid loss through the skin, and decrease the risk of skin cancer. Get medical attention immediately if signs of heat-related illnesses appear, such as vomiting, high fevers above 103°F, dizziness, confusion, fainting or loss of consciousness. The sooner medical attention is received, the less likely serious complications will occur.

Use safe insect repellant when outside to avoid contracting diseases carried by mosquitoes, ticks, and other insects. Go to <u>www.EPA.gov</u> for a list of safe and effective insect repellents. Always supervise children in or around pools and bodies of water. It only takes a few inches of water and 2 minutes for a child to drown. Make sure children properly wear lifejackets while on boats, docks, or playing near beaches.

We hope you and your family have a fun and safe summer! Please contact the health room with any questions regarding medications, physicals, immunizations, or other medical needs for next school year.

WHAT IS VFC?

VFC is a federal program that provides all ACIP/CDC approved^{*} vaccines to eligible children from birth up to age 19

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Children and adolescents are eligible prior to age 19 if they meet any of the following criteria:

- Medical Assistance • (Medicaid or M.A.) eligible
- Uninsured American Indian or
- Alaska Native
- Underinsured

WHAT IS **UNDERINSURED?**

Underinsured means the insurance plan does not cover any vaccines or certain vaccines, or the plan has fixed dollar limit or cap for vaccines. Once that amount has been met, children are eligible for VFC vaccines as "underinsured."

¿QUÉ ES EL PROGRAMA VFC?

El VFC es un programa federal que proporciona todas las vacunas aprobadas por ACIP/CDC* a todos los niños desde recién nacidos hasta la edad de 18 años.

¿QUIÉNES CALIFICAN PARA EL PROGRAMA?

Califican esos niños y adolescentes que tienen 19 años o menos y que cumpla con alguno de los siguientes criterios:

- Asistencia Médica .
- (Medicaid o M.A.) No tiene seauro -
- medico
- Si es Indio Americano o Nativo de Alaska
- "Seguro insuficiente"

QUÉ SIGNIFICA SEGURO INSUFICIENTE"

Seguro insuficiente significa que no cubre ninguna vacuna o solo ciertas vacunas, o tiene un límite fijo de dinero o un tope para vacunas. Una vez que esa cantidad ha sido alcanzada, los niños califican para este programa como niños con seguro insuficiente'
