

Pre-K 3 and 4 year old Application

Eligibility



- McKinney Vento enrollment paperwork
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF)
- Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA)
- Foster care documents
- Federal Income Tax Return 1099, 1040, or W2

Enrollment Order of Priority

- Household Income is 300% of Federal
 Poverty Line
- Active IEP or IFSP
- Home language indicated as something other than English
- Household Income is between 301%-600%
 of Federal Poverty Line
- Household Income is 601% of Federal
 Poverty Line or greater

Students currently enrolled in PK3 **are not** automatically eligible for PK4. Families must apply for the 24-25 school year under the new guidelines.

Guidelines



Enrollment

Enrollment is based on the time/date stamp of the application and the applicant's priority.



Private Providers

Private providers will require information on the parent's or guardian's place of employment.

Prekindergarten Application Process




Complete the application online.

After receiving a prequalification offer, you must reply within 10 days and submit all required documents. Once documents are reviewed and approved, your student will be officially enrolled in prek.
