Reminders and Important information



Attendance Message Strive for 9 or 90% (about 1/month)

We are working hard to improve our students' attendance this school year. It is crucial that your child is here on time every day and ready to learn unless you have a lawful excuse and have notified your child's teacher. A few reminders about absences:

- 1. When your child is absent, you must provide a written note of explanation within three days of your child returning to school.
- 2. If your child is absent due to an illness for 5 consecutive days or more, you must provide a doctor's note.
- 3. Please notify your child's teacher and the health room if your child tests positive for COVID.

Lawful absences include:

- 1. illness
- 2. death in the family
- 3. religious holiday
- 4. court appearance
- 5. suspension
- 6. state of emergency
- 7. hazardous weather conditions
- 8. lack or authorized transportation.
- 9. a visit with a parent/guardian who is an active member.
- 10. of the military and has been called to duty for or, is on leave from, or immediately returned from deployment to a combat zone or a combat support posting.
- Our school does monitor students who are chronically absent (missing 10% or more of the school year, as few as 2 days in one month, regardless of the reason). Teachers and staff will reach out to the families of these students in the form of a phone call, letter, or email to see what we can do to help.
