# **Important Visitor Information**

For the safety and security of our students and staff, we ask that <u>ALL</u> visitors, to bring their picture ID and for any reason, call the school office to make an appointment, before entering the main office. If you are not feeling well, please do not come to the school. We appreciate your cooperation and understanding with these procedures.

# **CAMERAS**

Ferndale Early Education Center is equipped with a video camera system. It covers selected interior and exterior public portions of the building and grounds. It is NOT monitored constantly, but it is monitored during emergency situations. During certain events, when the safety or security of students may be in question, authorized personnel from local, state, or federal police or fire emergency units may be given access to view images projected on the camera system. If you have any questions about the system, you should call the Supervisor of School Security at 410-222-5083.

# SECURITY DRILL



Each month the staff and students practice various security drills. In September, our school initiated an announced fire drill. We were able to evacuate the building in a safe and timely manner. Students followed their teachers' directions. Bus riders also participated in a Rear door evacuation. The staff and students did a marvelous job!

# News from the Health Room

Illness: How do I know when to keep my child home from school because of illness



Parents should keep their child home from school because of a serious illness, injury or a condition that can be passed on to other children. Although no comprehensive list is possible, the following conditions may be considered appropriate reasons to keep a student home from school:

### Examples of serious illness or injury:

- Temperature 100 °F or greater. Children with a fever (> 100 °F) must stay home until they are feverfree for 24 hours without feverreducing medication.
- Abdominal pain
- Earache
- Head injury
- Adverse medication effect
- Suspected fracture
- Chest pain
- Severe pain
- Severe shortness of breath or wheezing
- Cough for unknown reasons
- Vomiting or Diarrhea
- Red, Draining Eyes
- Undiagnosed Rash

Hello and welcome to Ferndale!


I am very excited to see all the new and or returning students! A good and healthy breakfast is served for free each and every day. It includes:



### **Attendance Policies and Procedures**

### **Truant Student:**

A child enrolled in school who is *unlawfully* absent from school:

8 days in a quarter, 15 days in a semester, or 20 days in the school year

• JB-RA Compulsory Attendance

### Lawful/Excused Causes of Absences:

- Death in family
- Illness/Injury
- Religious Holiday
- Court Appearance
- Suspension

- State of Emergency/Hazardous weather conditions
- Work approved or sponsored by the school
- Lack of Authorized School Transportation
- Visit with Parent on Active Duty

\*Note: Travel to see family and vacations are not considered lawful/excused absences, unless it is to visit with a military parent/guardian before, during active duty.

### **Chronically Absent Student:**

A child enrolled in school who is absent 10% or more of the school year, regardless of reason (including lawful and unlawful absences).

#### **Parent Reminders:**

-Our attendance committee will meet monthly to discuss **all** students who are *chronically absent* from school (missed 10% or more of the year at the date of our meeting). For example, this would include all students who have missed 2.5 or more days of school by Oct. 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2024. This is about 1-2 days per month and is equivalent to 18 days by the *end* of the school year. A committee member may contact you about your student's absences to get more information and see how we can help remove any barriers to good school attendance.

-Our motto in the North County Feeder system is to "Strive for 9." This means missing on average 1 or less days each month of school. You can click <u>HERE</u> to download a calendar to keep track of your student's absences.

-If your student needs to be absent for a lawful reason in accordance to our <u>county policy</u> and/or under a physician's direction, please provide a written note within **3 days** of their return to school. The note *should include* the student's name, the dates they were out, the reason they were out, and contact information for the parent/guardian. Alternatively, you can submit your attendance note through our Google Link. This can be found in English and Spanish on our website. Click <u>HERE</u>.

-For more information on attendance in prekindergarten click HERE.

-Students who are out of school in excess of 5 consecutive days of school require a physician's note to excuse the absences, per county policy. Please have your doctor's office include all the days they should be excused from school, not just the date they were seen in the office.
