Communicating with your School Nurse

Parents/Guardians - Keep Your School Nurse Up to Date:

1. Be sure to inform your school nurse about your child's health conditions or other special health needs in order to plan for safe management at school. Chronic health conditions including but not limited to: asthma, seizures, diabetes or life threatening allergies.
2. Remember to provide your school nurse with current emergency contact information.
3. Tell your school nurse if your child's health condition interferes with school attendance.
4. Make sure to tell your school nurse about medications and medical treatments your child requires during the school day.
5. Tell your school nurse about any changes in your child's health or mobility status, or about any infectious disease.
6. Speak to the school nurse if you need to obtain information about health insurance for your child.

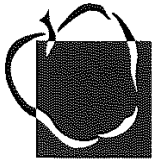
- ◆ **ALL** visitors **MUST** sign-in at the office. This is a **MUST DO, NO EXCEPTIONS**.
- ◆ Your driver's license/government issued ID will be scanned and a ID badge will be issued to be worn while in the school.
- ◆ **NO ONE** will be allowed entry into the building beyond the office without proper identification.
- ◆ Parents/Guardians and visitors must sign-in at the computer to receive a guest pass. This pass must be worn while in the building. This procedure helps to eliminate interruptions while classes are in session and safeguards your child.
- ◆ We request that you make an appointment in the office if there is a need to speak to your child's teacher. Often teachers are in meetings before and after school and this will allow the teacher to give you their undivided attention.

**CAUTION: PESTICIDE APPLICATION
Notification of Pesticide Application**



Dear Parents, Guardians, Visitors and Fellow Employees:

Anne Arundel County Public Schools manages pests (animals, plants, or microorganisms) which may interfere with human use of the school site, cause loss or damage to school structures or property, or diminish the quality of life for students, staff, and others. To deal with most pest issues, the school system utilizes **Integrated Pest Management**, a program for controlling pests. Chemicals are used as a last resort in this effort.


In accordance with Maryland law, each public school system must issue notification to parents and school employees whenever pesticides (herbicides) are to be applied in a school building and/or on school grounds during the school year. This information is also **posted** at the treatment location and on a centrally located bulletin board.

All VA State Pest Control, a Maryland licensed pest control applicator, will perform a pesticide treatment at **Linthicum Elementary School** to treat for termites. Specifically, the pesticide **“Premise Pre-Construction Insecticide”¹** will be applied to the pre-slab kindergarten addition construction at the school. The treatment will occur on Monday, September 30, 2019, starting at 8:00 AM. In case of inclement weather, the application will be made within the next two weeks.

The Office of Pesticide Programs of the United States Environmental Protection Agency has stated: “Where possible, persons who potentially are more sensitive, such as pregnant women and infants (less than two years old), should avoid any unnecessary pesticide exposure.”

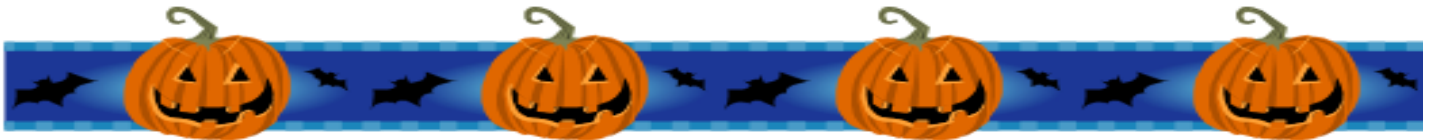

“Linthicum Elementary School is equipped with a video camera system. It covers selected interior and exterior public portions of the building and grounds. It is NOT monitored constantly, but it is monitored during emergency situations. During certain events, when the safety or security of students may be in question, authorized personnel from local, state, or federal police or fire emergency units may be given access to view images projected on the camera system.
