

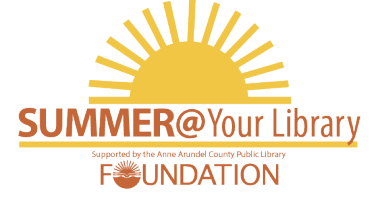
Lectura del Verano 2023

La investigación dice: “La pérdida de la lectura de verano se refiere a la disminución en el desarrollo de la lectura de un niño que puede ocurrir durante las vacaciones de verano cuando están lejos del aula y no participan en programas formales de alfabetización” (Allington & McGill-Franzen, 2003). La investigación es consistente: cuando los niños no leen durante el verano, el impacto de la pérdida de lectura de verano es significativo para todos. Los estudiantes que no leen durante el verano pierden aproximadamente tres meses de progreso. Estos meses se acumulan con el tiempo y los estudiantes se pueden quedar atrás de sus compañeros.

Nuestro objetivo es mantener a los estudiantes leyendo todo el año para mantener su nivel de lectura actual. Queremos detener la diapositiva de aprendizaje de verano.

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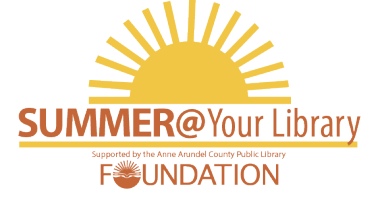

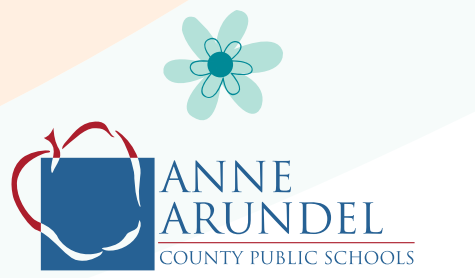
