Administrator's Message

2024 has arrived! We are hitting the ground running to meet the new year with all of the promise it brings and all the excitement that come with 'New.'

Attendance continues to be a major focus for the Meade Cluster of schools this year. Please help us make attendance a priority. When students are out of school, they are missing foundational instruction. Our most recent data shows 85% of our students attend school regularly and 15% of our students are chronically absent. Although we have improved from 74% of students regularly attending at this time last year, we are striving for a minimum of 95% in regular attendance. We can achieve this with your help. Please schedule family trips and appointments outside of school days/times. Congratulations to our 4th graders for leading the way. 88% of our 4th graders have been attending school regularly this school year to date.

Recently, we received our state score from last school year. You may have seen the news that the rubric for scoring schools changed back to the pre-Covid metric and many schools lost stars and points due to poor attendance and test scores. We are very proud to say we maintained our 4 star status and are well on our way to achieving a 5 star rating. Our growth in math and reading, as well as the staff and student satisfaction survey helped us be the highest rated school in our Meade Cluster. We are very proud of the growth we have made and are determined to claim that final star with the help of our community. We are committed to giving your children the best education possible and to meet their social and emotional needs.

I want to welcome all of our new families. I am attaching the Parent Handbook with all of our school information to this message. It is a quick way to learn about us, but I encourage you to contact your child's teacher or the office if you have any questions.


Stories are powerful. They are a way to learn about ourselves and the world in a way that invites reflection and conversation. They also are remembrances of our joy, sadness, and humanity.





UPDATES


- Thank you to everyone who donated items for our Toy Drive in December. The Sharing Donation is so appreciative of the items they received from Manor View!

Mandarin World Language & Culture (EEE)

In EEE Mandarin Chinese class, 4th and 5th grade students are exploring different winter holidays around the world and preparing for their holiday proposal project in the upcoming weeks. 2nd and 3rd grade students are learning different story elements from Chinese folk tales. They will make their own version with exciting and interesting details in the future and make puppets to showcase their story. 1st grade students are learning how animals work collaboratively in nature and will design their class animal mascot in the future. 

Family Help Line:

We are excited to share that the Family Help Line now has 5 language options: English, Spanish, Chinese, Vietnamese, and Urdu. Families can call 410-222-5001 and leave a message in their language of choice. Families can leave messages at any time, including after-hours and weekends. Bilingual Facilitators and the Communications Department will continue to check the messages and help families with their needs. Please share this additional tool with families!

BrightSpace: Please check your child's classroom BrightSpace online at least once a week for messages and weekly announcements. All teachers are communicating with their families through this app and we don't want you to miss any important information. You can also send messages to the teacher through BrightSpace, access homework instructions, see schedules, and more! In the event we have to go virtual for weather or other emergencies, BrightSpace is the format we will use to access lessons. Please become familiar with the app by visiting it regularly.

Our **Lost and Found** table is full! If your child is missing a coat, gloves, sweater, etc., please have them come visit the front lobby to find it.

We will be donating all abandoned items at the semester change.





Cafeteria Accounts: Parents, please bring your child's account to a positive balance. Many students have a negative account at this time. There is no school fund to cover unpaid balances. Each family is responsible for their own account. If you are eligible for free or reduced meals, you may sign up annually, but current balances are still the responsibility of each family.

Visit **MyPaymentPlus.com** for student lunch accounts. Note that there is a processing fee. If you chose not to set up an online account, please feel free to send money in with your child.

There are two options for placing money in an account. **Meal or General**. Placing money in the "**Meal Account**" will **only** allow your child to receive **One Entree** - a hot lunch, a choice of a fruit or vegetable and **only one** milk. **OR** "**Grab and Go**" which include cheese & yogurt combo w/ breakfast bread, a choice of a fruit/vegetable and **one** milk.

Placing money in "General Account" will allow your child to receive their First Entree (hot meal or grab and go) and if they choose to have Second Entree or just a milk. Students who receive free or reduced lunch cannot received a second lunch or an extra milk unless they have money in their "General Account"

Absence Notifications

When your child is absent from school, you must provide a note of explanation to the school within 3 days of your child's return to school. Absences due to illness in excess of 5 days requires a physician's note.

Tech Talk: Please be sure all students in grades 3-5 are bringing their devices to school daily. Devices need to engage with the school system in order to update for proper use. 1st and 2nd graders should have a school device at home. Please make sure it is fully charged and ready for use.

In the event school is closed for bad weather or an unexpected emergency, virtual learning may be provided and Chromebooks will be necessary.

MEDICAL CONCERNS & ADMINISTERING MEDICATION:

- Parents should make the school aware of any medical problems a child might have.
- Only the health room staff may administer medicine to students at school, including cough drops, aspirin or medicated chap stick.
- A medical authorization form is attached in newsletter in case you have a need for it.
 Please complete this whenever your child will need to take medication during the school day. This must be signed by a doctor.
- Any medication to be given at school must be delivered to the health room by an adult. PLEASE DO NOT HAVE YOUR CHILD BRING ANY MEDICATION TO SCHOOL.
