#### What is Growth Mindset?




It is important for students to participate in productive struggle in order to grow in many different ways!

### Federal Impact Program Survey

Parents who are active military or who live or work on Federal Property in Maryland are asked to complete this year's <u>Federal Impact</u> <u>Aid Survey</u> when it becomes available on September 29, 2023.

You will be asked to verify your home address and identify if it is located on federal property. You will also complete sections identifying if a family member is in the military or works on federally owned property in Maryland. The survey should only take a couple of minutes to complete and, be assured, all data collected is kept completely confidential.

#### Why Complete This Survey

Anne Arundel County Public Schools, like many local school districts across the United States, include within our boundaries parcels of land that are owned by the Federal Government or that have been removed from the local tax rolls by the Federal Government. Federal property is exempt from local property taxes. By submitting an application to the Department of Education each January, AACPS receives approximately \$2 million to assist in educating all our students.

### **CSI (Comprehensive Support and Improvement) Information**

AACPS currently has eight schools identified as Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) schools by the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE). These schools have been identified for CSI for the areas of Low Graduation Rate or low-performing student groups, based on the 2018–2019 school year.

Our school is one of the CSI-identified schools. Over the next three years, we will work alongside MSDE to conduct a resource inequity analysis, devise an improvement plan, and receive hands-on coaching support and resources to enhance student achievement. We will also continue to receive personalized support through our central office partners to meet MSDE requirements and, more importantly, ensure the success of our students.
