Mayo Elementary School is equipped with a video camera system. It covers selected interior and exterior public portions of the building and grounds. 

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION 2021-2022 School Year

Mayo Elementary School will begin Kindergarten registration for the school year 2021-2022 on April 7, 2021. To be eligible to attend Kindergarten, students must be five years old on or before September 01, 2021. Parents are asked to register their child on the Online Registration Portal within the Anne Arundel County Public Schools Website. Please go to https://www.aacps.org/Page/1116 for more information.

You must submit the child's birth certificate, immunization record and $\underline{2}$ proofs of residency (one must be a mortgage or rental agreement, the other a current utility bill dated within the last 60 days).

An inspirational picture book about Clara, a quiet girl who transformed herself through education and bravery while working in a garment factory as an impoverished immigrant.


Amelia to Zora: Twenty Six Women Who Changed the World
