

Mayo Elementary School is equipped with a video camera system. It covers selected interior and exterior public portions of the building and grounds. 

Some things to work on over the summer.... • Practice letters in your first and last name (then the whole alphabet!) • Proper letter formation when writing (start at the top and go down, we like using Handwriting without Tears). You can check out Letter School App, as well. • Count, count, count! We go all the way up to 100 in Kindergarten.

- Practice number recognition 0-10.
 Practice shapes and colors. Practice opening juice boxes, snack bags, etc.
 Zipping coats and buttoning pants.
 Students must be able to use the bathroom independently in Kindergarten.
- Don't forget to visit your local library for their Summer Reading Programs!

Kindergarten children will come to school on the regular buses with the other children. Pick



up time at the bus stop will be approximately 7:40am. Mayo Elementary opens at 7:55am and instruction begins at 8:10am. Dismissal time is 2:35pm. On the day of your conference please stop by the school office to discuss your child's afternoon bus number and to pick up a name tag for your child. Please see that he or she wears it to school each day for the first two weeks so that the bus driver can easily identify your child's afternoon bus stop. Kindergarten parents are asked to arrange that their child be taken to and picked up from the bus stop by a responsible person.



Inclement Weather and Emergency School Closings

Make-up Days

Three make-up days are included at the end of the school year.

- · Any additional days needed will be added to the June closing date
- •Unused make-up days shall be deducted from the June closing

End of Marking Periods

- If emergency closings affect the end of any marking period, the marking period will be extended so that both early dismissal days occur at the end of the marking period. This applies to all schools.
- There must be one non-si day between the second and third marking periods.

Religious Observances

AACPS will operate on a normal schedule on the following days of major religious observance:

- ·November 4, 2021: Diwali (No Moon Day)
- July 10, 2022: Eid al-Adha Jewish and Muslim religious observance dates begin at sundown the evening prior to the dates noted and conclude at sundown the next

Tests & Examinations

AACPS tests and examinations (including mandated tests and nts) shall not be scheduled on any of the religious observance noted in this calendar. Tests and examinations for a grade will not be administered on the school day following any of the religious observances noted in this calendar unless the observance concludes on a Friday or Saturday night. Similarly, AACPS tests and examinations (including mandated tests and assessments) for Evening High School students shall also not be scheduled on the evening before or the day of evening of a religious observance

School Sponsored Activities

For Rosh Hashanah, Yorn Kippur, Eid-al-Fitr, and Eid al-Adha, no athletics or other school-sponsored extracurricular activities will take place after sundown on the day before the observance or before sundown on the first day of a

Student Absences

Students absent from school due to to make up work missed due to that absence. Such absence shall not affect a student's eligibility for perfect attendance recognition
