Some of the ways I can provide assistance are:

- ✓ Assisting parents when children are having difficulty regularly attending school regularly.
- ✓ Enrolling families experiencing homelessness. <u>If you've lost housing, please contact the school counselor.</u> Resources are available such as transportation and agency referrals.
- ✓ Assisting with the enrollment of caretakers who are raising children without legal custody.

REMEMBER.....

- ✓ When your child is absent, a note must be submitted to the teacher.
- ✓ Children absent more than 5 consecutive days, require a doctor's note for the absences to be excused.
- ✓ Students missing more than 18 days in a school year/ 2 days per month are considered chronically truant.
- ✓ Reach out to your school counselor if you are concerned about your child's attendance.
