# i-Ready

As you know, the students have participated in the i-Ready diagnostic. I-Ready, a computer adaptive tool is, like Goldie Locks and the Three Bears, trying to find the spot that is "just right." In doing so, students, by design got about 50% of the items correct and 50% of the items incorrect. While this may



have been frustrating for families, this was by design. i-Ready reading is going <u>up to</u> three grade levels above a student's current grade in order to find the "just right" for the student.

i-Ready results will be shared with parents in the coming weeks.



# FAQs - Grading & Attendance

#### What type of grading will we be experiencing this fall?

Traditional letter grading will be in effect for the fall semester. The standard grading policy (II-RA, Grading; Administrative Regulation II-RA, Grading) will be followed.

#### How will attendance be taken?

For students in kindergarten through Grade 5, attendance will be recorded based on participation in one live class during the virtual school day. Attendance at the secondary level will be tracked by period every day in accordance with a student's virtual schedule. NOTE: Attendance for students in the Infants & Toddlers, ECI, and pre-kindergarten programs will not be recorded.

#### <u>When a student cannot attend virtual live-learning, how will this impact their attendance? If</u> <u>they are not in synchronous teaching, does this count against their attendance?</u>

A family must submit an application for Alternate Attendance to participate in Virtual Learning outside of the school day: <u>https://www.aacps.org/alternateattendance</u>. The request is reviewed. If approved, then the student will be counted present, if the student watches the recorded classroom lesson videos and completes the associated assignments in a timely fashion.


