In closing, the Front Office Team will be in the building throughout the summer. Please feel free to reach out to us regarding any questions.





Early Dismissal / Change in Dismissal -- All Early Dismissals or Change in Dismissals must be done prior to 2:00 PM


<u>Late Arrival</u> -- Any arrival after school begins at 8:00 AM, is considered tardy. You must bring your student into office to sign them in.



WHAT WE'RE LEARNING



WHAT WE'RE LEARNING

<u>Math:</u> We will begin Unit 13 Geometry Coordinate Planes and Polygons. Students will graph ordered pairs, interpret coordinate values of points in the context of a situation, and draw a line to connect points. Students make predictions about data points that are not specifically graphed on a line.

<u>Reading:</u> As we end this unit, fifth grade students will understand how creative thinking can help them solve problems. The texts in this unit are specific to the development of secret codes and inventions in order to highlight the creativity involved in solving specific problems.

<u>Writing:</u> Shaping Texts: From Essay and Narrative to Memoir, Students research and reflect on their own experiences to write a moving piece. Students learn the craft of memoir writing by studying the writing of other students. They explore various structures to determine the form and structure that will best suit their idea. Students engage in the full writing process to reinforce that they are authors too.

<u>Science:</u> In this 4th quarter, the students begin working on a water filtration project. The intended outcome of this project is for students to design, build, test, and revise a water filter that will give them the clearest possible water. This is framed within a storyline where the students will be paid by a water company to produce the largest amount of clear water.

<u>Social Studies:</u> We are finishing up the findings of American economic, political, and civic life (1900-present) and what does it mean to be living and learning in the "land of the free?" We finish off with understanding the 1st amendment and the role of the media
