If your student missed a testing session, please know that they will need to complete make-up testing sessions to fully complete MCAP testing.



Notes from the Office

Early Dismissal / Change in Dismissal -- All Early Dismissals or Change in Dismissals must be done prior to 2:00 PM


<u>Late Arrival</u> -- Any arrival after school begins at 8:00 AM, is considered tardy. You must bring your student into office to sign them in.

Lost and Found — On May 17 and June 12 any items in Lost and Found will be donated to Meade Attic. You can come daily from 2:45—3:15 to look for items.



At Home Writing Grades 1 & 2

- 1. Show an interest in, and ask questions about the things your child says, draws or tries to write. Encourage your child to write even if it is scribbling.
- 2. Make sure your child sees you writing. Your child will learn about writing by watching you write. Talk about what you are writing, so your child will understand why writing is important.
- 3. Give your child opportunities to practice authentic writing by helping them write notes to friends and family members, write lists of things to do or buy, and write about life events.
- 4. Create a family message board. Write messages to your child and encourage your child to write messages.

Reading and Writing go Together

As children develop, they learn to speak first. Reading follows and then the ability to write. Writing is a great way to reinforce your child's reading.

Writing is an important skill for people of all ages and an important part communicating in our daily lives. However, it is a difficult skill for children to master. In the early grades, students advance from writing words, to complete sentences, and then to paragraphs in order to share their ideas and stories. In grades three through five, whether writing by hand or on the computer, school assignments and exams require students to write short answers or longer essays to assess what they have learned. Ultimately, in elementary school we are laying the foundations for all our students future written communications!

This month we will focus on writing and how you can help your child become a better writer. Begin by finding a table or desk with a smooth flat surface and a good lighting source. Assemble some lined paper, pencils, pens and markers. Let's get ready to write!

At Home Writing Grades 3 & 5

- 1. Talk with your children as much as possible about their ideas and impressions, and encourage them to describe people, places and events to you.
- 2. Encourage your child to keep a journal to write about things that happen at home and at school.. This is a great writing practice and an excellent way to vent or share feelings.
- 3. Help your child with writing by asking questions to help clarify the details of stories and assignments and provide your child with help in organizing their thoughts and ideas. Talk about the objective of the writing.
- 4. Avoid writing for your child. Don't write a paper for your child that will be turned in as his or her work or rewrite your child's work. Meeting a writing deadline, taking responsibility for the finished product and feeling ownership of a written product is also an important part of the writing process.



Instructional Focus for the Month of May:

Writing: We will continue unit 4: Realistic Fiction Narrative Writing. We will focus on a new setting and adventure for a character from a familiar book. As we do so, we will hone in on creating a problem and a satisfying conclusion for our reader.

Social Studies: We will be learning how to make choices between wants and needs. We will also learn about different goods and services.

Explicit Comprehension: We will continue to practice reading grade-level texts, while focusing on comprehension skills such as identifying the central message, asking and answering questions, connecting events, describing characters, and using text features.

Foundations: We will learn and apply grade-level phonics and word skills when decoding words. FUNdations will focus on closed syllable words, new vowel team sounds, and suffixes (s, ed, ing) Math: We will be finishing up unit 12. In this unit, students learn about measuring and comparing length, about telling time to the nearest hour and half-hour, and about collecting, organizing, representing and displaying data. Then we will start unit 13, our last unit of the year which will be on equal shares (halves and quarters).

WHAT WE'RE LEARNING

Math: Data Analysis- Students will learn how to measure and display data.

Reading: <u>Fiction</u>- Understanding the plot and structure of a story, determining the central message

Science/Social Studies: We Are Researchers- Students will continue to learn about how to keep our bodies healthy and what makes something healthy.____



Learning Focus

Reading: This month we will be focusing on fictional stories. We will be looking at topics such as point of view, relationships between events, and lesson learned.

Writing: This month we will be focusing on writing fractured fairy tales.

Math: This month, we will be completing our measurement unit. During this unit we will be learning about mass, volume, measurement with a ruler and time. We will be using this information to make pictographs, bar graphs, and line plots.

Science: This month we will continue working on our engineering project of building and testing a parachute to learn about air resistance and drag

Social Studies: This month we will continue our Environmental Action Project.



WHAT WE'RE LEARNING

<u>Math:</u> We will be in the middle Unit 11 Dividing Fractions. This unit builds on earlier work with division and fractions to establish that a fraction describes an indicated division. Students divide fractions, limited to division of a whole number by a unit fraction and a division of a unit fraction by a non-zero whole number. they will explore situations involving equal sharing division and equal grouping division.

<u>Reading:</u> As we continue Theme 4: Creativity in IRA. Students are reading informational to quote accurately to explain what the text says explicitly. Students will also integrate information from several texts to then write about the subject knowledgeably.

<u>Writing:</u> Shaping Texts: From Essay and Narrative to Memoir, students learn that content influences form and make decisions about the genre that best conveys their content. Students will begin to reflect on their year as a 5th grader to write their own memoirs.

<u>Science</u>: In this 4th quarter, the students begin working on a water filtration project. The intended outcome of this project is for students to design, build, test, and revise a water filter that will give them the clearest possible water. This is framed within a storyline where the students will be paid by a water company to produce the largest amount of clear water.

<u>Social Studies:</u> We are currently learning about the challenges of American economic, political, and civic life (1900-present) and what does it mean to be living and learning in the "land of the free?"
