

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School Attendance Matters

In Kindergarten and First grades, 1 in 4 students are chronically absent. Did you know that chronic absenteeism in Kindergarten can negatively impact reading proficiency by the end of 3rd grade? (www.attendanceworks.org)

It is important for your child to come to school each and every day. If they miss school because they are sick, please let their teacher know. Any student who is absent three or more days will need a doctor's excuse to return to school.
