FEDERAL IMPACT PROGRAM SURVEY

Parents who are active military or who live or work on Federal Property in Maryland are asked to complete this year's <u>Federal Impact Aid Survey</u> when it becomes available on September 29, 2023.

You will be asked to verify your home address and identify if it is located on federal property. You will also complete sections identifying if a family member is in the military or works on federally owned property in Maryland. The survey should only take a couple of minutes to complete and, be assured, all data collected is kept completely confidential.

Why Complete This Survey

Anne Arundel County Public Schools, like many local school districts across the United States, include within our boundaries parcels of land that are owned by the Federal Government or that have been removed from the local tax rolls by the Federal Government. Federal property is exempt from local property taxes. By submitting an application to the Department of Education each January, AACPS receives approximately \$2 million to assist in educating all our students.

SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOLS PROJECT

Dear Families and Staff,

The Anne Arundel County Department of Public Works (DPW) is leading a Safe Routes to Schools project in partnership with the County Office of Transportation, Anne Arundel County Public Schools, and the Maryland State Highway Administration. This project aims to improve safety, mobility, and accessibility for students to walk and bike to and from elementary schools around the County. Seventeen elementary schools, listed below, were identified in the County's transportation master plan, *Move Anne Arundel!*, for assessment and are currently under evaluation.

DPW has assessed existing conditions within the walk zone and surrounding attendance area for each school and developed draft planning-level recommendations to improve pedestrian and bicycle student transportation, including infrastructure, policies, and educational outreach programs. The agency now needs your input.

DPW has created a project webpage compiling reports for each school, which summarizes findings and draft recommendations. Please visit https://tinyurl.com/srtsaacounty to review this information.
