It is imperative that your child charges his/her Chromebook fully at home each night and brings it to school. Please also encourage your child to bring the charger and his/her headphones to school each day. Please note, students may test on additional or alternate dates to accommodate for absences, IEP/504/EL accommodations, and schedule changes.
