#### Hello, SPES families!

We are thrilled to have students back this week! It is hard to believe that it has almost been a full year since our building was closed to students and the learning curve has been tremendously steep for all of us. It has been overwhelmingly impressive to see our community of parents and teachers step up to the challenge. While parents have collaborated with each other to support children in the neighborhood, our teachers have become a one-person production company every day they teach. Our growth is truly remarkable, and the word "school" creates a much different image now than it did a year ago.

It is exciting to be one step closer to a more normal routine and while we realize the road ahead is also unfamiliar to us, we have proven that we have the determination to push forward! Our children have shown resilience far beyond expectations, so please take a moment to tell your child how proud we are of his/her perseverance throughout virtual learning.

In many ways, this week is the first week of school and our teachers will be reviewing routines and procedures as well as re-establishing the class community with children and their new cohorts. We will be coaching our students on many new safety measures, one of which is wearing a mask. Please review with your child the importance of wearing a mask. Wearing a mask is not just an expectation we have for all children, but a safety measure vital to our student and staff safety. Children will benefit having several masks in their backpack in case they get lost or uncomfortable, especially after recess.

This week, your child will also see teachers use multiple screens and webcams to deliver instruction. Teachers have been practicing with their colleagues to make sure our kids at home and kids at school can see and hear them. We encourage children and parents to ask questions throughout this transition, it is the only way we learn and grow.

On March 2nd we kick-of AACPS Unites: Celebrating Diversity in Literacy and the theme for March is "Cultivate Compassion." Children will hear stories and/or do activities related to this theme.

On March 10th, teachers will be holding conferences, which will be a great opportunity to discuss your child's progress. More

# This Month's Counselor's Corner

#### Hello, I'm Mrs. Katie McCord, SPES School Counselor

Our building is a buzz with change in the air. Jon Gordon says "There's a myth that people don't like change. We actually like what change produces. We just don't like the messy transition required to create the change." When we embrace the

waves of change, we'll learn to ride the wave to success. Your children have been doing a wonderful job mastering change this year, and this is a lifelong skill.

Whether students are returning for 2 days of hybrid style learning or staying virtual 5 days a week, it's different for students and teachers alike. Change is both exciting and unsettling. Over the last two weeks, every student was asked to use the 3 C's (Connect, Cope, and Communicate) during a time of change. Please encourage your children to 1) "connect" with staff and classmates they have built relationships already, 2) to "cope" using a calming strategy when they become uneasy, and 3) to "communicate" their feelings to parents, teachers, and me. I'm available to meet via google meeting for your child to communicate to me and work through feelings to be available to learn.

The character trait for March is Mindfulness. We will practice mindful thinking in class and also during counseling lessons in March. Waiting has been a theme for everyone lately. Like Dr. Seuss wrote in "Oh, The Places You'll Go," saying "Everyone is just waiting." We're all waiting for the safe return of normal routines. We're waiting to hug each other again, to travel freely, to send our children to school every day, and to linger in public spaces. Much of our activities involve waiting like traffic lights, doctor's offices, and store lines. But most of us get antsy waiting. We can reframe this and realize there are gifts to waiting and make waiting an active event by bringing mindfulness to it. Notice what having our plans thwarted stirs up inside of us, such as the tapping foot and the rat-a-tat-tat of thoughts of wanting for things to be different. We can teach ourselves and our children to make a mindfulness practice out of cooling your heels using an acronym: W-A-I-T or Watch, Allow, Investigate, and Take a Breath.

- WATCH the reaction you experience whenever you wait.
- ALLOW whatever is arising to be there. Waiting and impatience are a very human combination.

**INVESTIGATE** how the act of waiting feels in your body. Do you clench your jaw and brace your core more tightly as each moment slowly passes? Relax and soften your body.

TAKE a purposeful breath in and out.

During the weeks of March 22nd - April 9th I will deliver the Erin's Law lessons about child abuse. These are required lessons for schools to provide, and I will send a letter to each home to provide more information. The lessons have been modified to condense them for a shorter lesson time frame, yet the longer lessons can be previewed on the Anne Arundel County Public Schools website.
