This Month's Counselor's Corner

Hello, I'm Mrs. Katie McCord, SPES School Counselor

The character trait for December is Compassion. In November we focused on empathy and the capacity to take another's perspective and understand their

feeling. This month we delve into the action that comes from that empathy. Compassion is action and being moved to help someone, especially someone who is sad or in pain to help alleviate or prevent their suffering. Acts of compassion can be simple acts of kindness like opening the door, helping someone carry something, showing gratitude, giving coats, food, and gifts to those in need or more involved acts like, adopting or fostering a pet, fostering a child, starting a charity to help others, and caring for the sick or elderly. There truly are no boundaries.

While the action of compassion is defined by its helpfulness, the qualities of compassion include kindness, patience, warmth, and perseverance. I have seen SPES students show empathy and compassion to fellow students who are having technical difficulties or are getting frustrated and upset during online learning. They quickly tell them it's happened to them and don't worry, it'll be okay, you can finish later, etc.

This month, we have an opportunity for parents to encourage your children to share in compassionate thinking with the coat drive and the Gift Bag collection by Good Neighbors Group. Have them consider the people who will be cold this winter without a warm coat as well as the students from Annapolis Elementary who may not be as fortunate as they are and would be over the moon to get a small gift bag.

Harvest for the Hungry – Kids Helping Kids: I'm so proud to be part of such a generous school population. We raised more than \$1,000 for AAC Food Bank.

Coat, Belt, Suspender Drive: Look through your closets and drop off winter coats, belts and suspenders at the drop box on the porch of the SP Chambers of Commerce at 1 Holly Avenue. The coats will be distributed by the Orphan Grain Train charity to homeless people in Baltimore city.

Holiday Sharing Gift Bag Drive: Good Neighbor's Group has kindly taken on the Giving Tree activity SPES usually does this time of the year. December Counseling Lessons: Every grade will have a discussion about compassion this month. In addition, Kindergarten lessons will be about Bucket Filling, Feelings and expressing feelings, 1st grade lessons are about Tattling and expressing feelings, 2nd grade lessons are about Teasing and expressing feelings, 3rd grade lessons are about Substance Abuse and Decision Making, and 4th/5th grade lessons are about Substance Abuse and Conflict Resolution.

Individual Counseling: Some students have adapted to on-line learning while many still struggle with it. I'm here to meet with your child via phone or google meeting to help them plan for success on-line and as we transition to hybrid for some. It can help for them to share their thoughts and feelings. Social Emotional Growth PBIS/Second Step/Character Traits

PBIS: All of our classes earned at least one big PAW for their positive ("PAWSitive") behaviors. Mrs. Langhirt's class was the first to get their 3rd big PAW.

Second Step: We are continuing with Empathy lessons in 2nd Step which include identifying feelings, recognizing the same and different feelings, and showing compassion for others. Look for the home links from your child's teachers to support these important skills.

-Student's <u>Full</u>Legal Name -Homeroom Teacher's Name -Date and Reason for Absence






