SPES' character trait for March is *Mindfulness*. Mindfulness is the practice of bringing your full awareness to the present. The Harvard Help Guide states that "Mindfulness is the practice of purposely focusing your attention on the present moment—and accepting it without judgment. Mindfulness is now being examined scientifically and has been found to be a key element in stress reduction and overall happiness." Through mindfulness we can train ourselves to show compassion to ourselves and others and to be more grateful. Research also finds that mindfulness practice decreases stress and anxiety, increases attention, improves relationships, and strengthens compassion. It is a positive practice for students and families.

One mindful activity you can try this month is actively noticing nature during walks with your children. When we consciously engage our senses during walks it calms and grounds us and relaxes our mind and body. It also helps restore attention and boosts the brain's ability to think. During this month, I will teach every class a lesson on mindfulness and its benefits. The 5th Grade Human Relations Students will share about Mindfulness on the Monday morning announcements. Teachers are encouraged to take "Mindful Moments" throughout the month of March with classes as well to build a practice where students can train their attention and breath for a moment and then focus on their learning.

March Guidance Lesson Topics: Kindergarten & First Grade- Mindfulness and Stranger Safety, Second through Fifth grade - Mindfulness.
