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### **Counselor's Corner**

### Welcome Back!

We are Building Bright Futures this year, and part of my role as the school counselor is to help students build a resilient foundation by learning social emotional skills, coping techniques, and school success skills. This year I will support student success skills and social emotional learning via class lessons in each class and some visits during morning community meetings. SPES also has our PAWS PBIS expectations, 2nd Step Lessons, and Monthly Character Traits to support social emotional learning. Character trait meaning and examples will be shared on the morning announcements, during morning meetings, and a partial or full counseling lesson about this trait.



### September's character trait is Respect.

As parents, we can model respect by being respectful to our kids first and sharing with them what respect looks like. At times when you witness your child showing disrespect, stay calm, look for the cause, teach problem solving alternatives to disrespect, and positively recognize when they show genuine respect. We will do the same at school, and they will hear about respect in my lessons, on the morning announcements, and from their teachers.

September counseling lessons will include the role of the counselor, respect, self-regulation, and calming strategies. I will ask students to choose "One Word" for this school year to inspire them through mid-June. Intermediate students will set a goal for the year. Parents can help their children set their own goals. Helping them choose specific goals with mini goals will also help them feel achievement along the way. It's helpful to have check points to review and reflect on how they are doing with the goal.

I am here for all students, so feel free to email or call if you have any questions, suggestions, or you would like me to meet with your child. Throughout the school year I meet with students for their individual needs. I often have student groups for an occasional fun relationship building lunch bunch. I will also run groups that last 6-10 sessions for some students during lunch time for friendship, and coping skills for big emotions. I can also provide groups for family changes, managing anger, anxiety, study/organizational skills, grief, and self-esteem/confidence if a student, parent, or teacher identifies this need and there is a group of similar age students with the need. Please let me know via phone or email (kmccord@aacps.org) if your child would benefit from a group. Students in regular groups will need parent/guardian permission to participate.

Parent workshops can also be helpful. Some options include supporting your child with anxiety, executive functioning, internet safety and social media, resilience and confidence, growth mindset, and positive discipline and parenting. ### FIRE LANES AND BUS LOOPS

Maryland Motor Vehicle Law §21-101.1(b)2,3 states,

A person may not drive a motor vehicle in violation of any provision of this title on any property that is owned by or under the control of this State or any of its political subdivisions, county boards of education, or community colleges and that is open to vehicular traffic and used by the public in general. Any person who violates any provision of this subsection is in violation of the law to the same extent and is subject to the same penalty as if the motor vehicle were driven on a highway.

As you know, in a critical emergency, the loss of every minute caused by vehicles blocking fire and police department access can become critical.

For Car Rider Dismissal and Car Rider arrival, please move all the way down to the white line and stay next to the curb when picking up and dropping off students for their safety!!!

## Applying for a Commercial Background Check

Please apply for your background check early. It does take time to process, so plan ahead!

The format for applying for commercial background checks has changed. Applicants for a commercial background check will still utilize the AACPS.org website. The background application can be found under the <u>School Security tab</u> under the <u>Families tab</u> (www.aacps.org/families).

In the new system, applicants will be prompted to create an account. They will then receive a confirmation number for successfully creating an account. Within a few seconds of creating the account, the applicant will receive an email which will invite them to a portal where they fill in their information for a background check.

Applicants MUST have an email address to complete the background check.

As was the practice in the past, applicants will not receive the final status of their background investigation. Please check with your *TEACHER* for the status.



### **DISMISSAL**

Any changes to your child's normal dismissal method must be made <u>IN</u>
ADVANCE IN WRITING by 1:00PM!!

Student can bring a note to the homeroom teacher or an email can be sent to the homeroom teacher and both secretaries, <a href="mailto:LMSykes@aacps.org">LMSykes@aacps.org</a> and <a href="mailto:DBoring@aacps.org">DBoring@aacps.org</a>.

If your child will be a car rider, please come and get a sign for EVERY car that will pick up your child up at the end of the day! They

are free and will help us with the flow of traffic!



### **CAMERAS**

Severna Park Elementary School is equipped with a video camera system. It covers selected interior and exterior public portions of the building and grounds.

It is NOT monitored constantly, but it is monitored during emergency situations.

During certain events, when safety or security of students may be in question, authorized personnel from local, state, or federal police or fire emergency units may be given access to view images projected on the camera system.

### **BIRTHDAYS**

Remember that we do not allow food items as birthday treats for a variety of health and safety reasons.

Students are able to bring a very small birthday share (stickers, pencils, minierasers) rather than a food based treat IF they would like too (it is certainly not mandatory). All treats are completely voluntary.

(We <u>will</u> continue to have birthday pencils in the office and the PTA will continue the 'birthday books'

program again this year.)

### Dear Parents and School Supporters,

Beginning August 1, 2023, Severna Park Elementary proudly rejoins Harris Teeter's Together in Education program to help raise funds for our school. Last year we earned over \$300.00 and we hope to beat that amount this year! It's easy and it's FREE! Simply give the cashier **our school code**, <u>4433</u>, and your VIC card when you check out and your card will be linked for the entire 2023-24 school year **Of** <u>You may link your card here</u>: <u>Harris Teeter VIC Link</u>. That's it! **All VIC cards were cleared as of June 1, 2023, and current members must be relinked starting August 1, 2023. <u>You only must link your VIC card once each school year.</u>** 

Starting Tuesday, August 1, 2023, when customers purchase select Harris Teeter Brand products using their linked VIC card, Harris Teeter contributes a percentage of those purchase dollars to our school. There is no additional charges or cost for customers to participate.

Harris Teeter Brand products include Harris Teeter, Harris Teeter Farmers Market, H.T. Traders, and Harris Teeter Organics. As a bonus program, if you purchase prescription medications from our pharmacy, a percentage of the product purchase also goes back to our school. However randomly weighted or bulk items in produce, meat (except poultry), seafood, deli bakery, prepared foods within these brands are not included in the program.

The TIE program proceeds will be used for technology, supplies, equipment, teacher preparation, and student learning materials. This program does not interfere with your VIC savings or cost you any money! Don't forget to link your VIC card to **our account code #4433** next time you are shopping at Harris Teeter.

## TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS OF ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS VOLUNTARY STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE COVERAGE

Each year, school children have accidents. Medical costs can be expensive, and unexpected bills can cause hardships. Even if you have other insurance, it is often not enough as coverage can require high deductibles or coinsurance payments.

Anne Arundel County Public Schools <u>does not</u> purchase blanket accidental medical or dental insurance for sports, school sponsored activities, or student activity while school is in session. However, we have made arrangements with *Bob McCloskey Insurance* to offer accident coverage to all enrolled students at a modest premium. Through this program, parents/guardians have the opportunity to purchase this protection for their child.

Some of the advantages of this insurance include:

<u>At-School Student Accident Coverage</u>: This provides insurance for the hours and days when school is in session and while students are attending school sponsored and supervised activities on or off school premises. Coverage is provided during:

- The school day, on school premises, while school is in session.
- Direct and uninterrupted travel to and from home and scheduled classes.
- School sponsored and supervised sports (excluding high school football).
- Travel to and from school sponsored and supervised sports while in school approved vehicle.
- Once effective, coverage continues until the earlier date where the enrolled students coverage has been in place for twelve months or the first day of the next school year.

<u>Around the Clock - 24-hour Accident coverage</u>: This provides insurance coverage around-the-clock, anywhere in the world. Coverage is provided:

- Before, during and after school.
- Weekends, vacation and all summer including summer school.
- School sponsored and extracurricular sports (excluding high school football).
- Once effective, coverage continues until the earlier date where the enrolled students coverage has been in place for twelve months or the first day of the next school year.

All coverage becomes effective on the date that the completed application and premium are received by **Bob McCloskey Insurance.** or online enrollment is completed.
