Families that drop off their students via the car line in the morning and afternoon, please be mindful of the entrances and exits for our bus drivers. It is imperative that our buses are able to enter and exit the school at the appropriate times so they can pick up students on time. Our drivers also have high school and middle school routes! In the morning and afternoon, if there is not enough room to pull up in the car line without blocking the exit to the bus loop, please wait for traffic to move. In the afternoon, if the car line forms on Riggs Avenue, please make sure the entrance to the bus loop remains clear for our buses to enter.

Information regarding this event will be communicated via email as it approaches. Please remember that Halloween costumes will need to remain in compliance with AACPS dress code. Counselor's Corner

SPES' character traits for October are Effort & Integrity. Counseling lessons will include integrity, goal setting and the joy of learning new things through effort and trying even when it's hard. We will learn the difference between a growth mindset and fixed mindset, so we can choose to grow. I encourage parents to help their child look at something they hope to achieve, develop a plan to get there, and understand that it takes time, patience, practice, and often failure before they can reach the goal. Share your struggles and eventual successes with them as well. We will be emphasizing putting in effort, good character, honesty, and integrity this month in morning announcements, community meetings and in class reflection daily. We hope SPES students will sincerely do the right thing in difficult situations for moral reasons. When students make a moral mistake, it is a chance for them to learn to build character and integrity. We can apply the "growth mindset" model to learning good behavior as well as learning academics.

Parents are kids' most important role models for building integrity. Children are like sponges, soaking up everything around them, both good and bad. Go out of your way to make moral choices and talk about why you do so in front of your children.

I have small lunch bunch groups for relationship building, human relations planning, and follow up on goal setting lessons. I will start some focused groups in October. Please reach out to me if your child might benefit from a friendship, coping skills, or study skills/organization group. Groups meet 6-10 times per topic.

Harvest for the Hungry Drive: Every Fall the schools in Anne Arundel County hold food drives to benefit families and children in our county by giving the food and funds to the AAC Food Bank. One in eight families in Anne Arundel County struggle with food insecurity and the AAC Food Bank serves these families. You could drop off food anytime this month, but we choose to have one big week for collection and spirit days to get the kids excited. This year we will collect food during the week of October 23rd-27th. Please also consider a financial contribution via the www.aacps.org/harvest website anytime from October 1st-31st. Look for a flier and spirit days to excite students to participate.





Dear Parents and School Supporters,

Beginning August 1, 2023, Severna Park Elementary proudly rejoins Harris Teeter's Together in Education program to help raise funds for our school. Last year we earned over \$300.00 and we hope to beat that amount this year! It's easy and it's FREE! Simply give the cashier **our school code**, <u>4433</u>, and your VIC card when you check out and your card will be linked for the entire 2023-24 school year **Of** <u>You may link your card here</u>: <u>Harris Teeter VIC Link</u>. That's it! All VIC cards were cleared as of June 1, 2023, and current members must be relinked starting August 1, 2023. <u>You only must link your VIC card once each school year.</u>

Starting Tuesday, August 1, 2023, when customers purchase select Harris Teeter Brand products using their linked VIC card, Harris Teeter contributes a percentage of those purchase dollars to our school. There is no additional charges or cost for customers to participate.

Harris Teeter Brand products include Harris Teeter, Harris Teeter Farmers Market, H.T. Traders, and Harris Teeter Organics. As a bonus program, if you purchase prescription medications from our pharmacy, a percentage of the product purchase also goes back to our school. However randomly weighted or bulk items in produce, meat (except poultry), seafood, deli bakery, prepared foods within these brands are not included in the program.

The TIE program proceeds will be used for technology, supplies, equipment, teacher preparation, and student learning materials. This program does not interfere with your VIC savings or cost you any money! Don't forget to link your VIC card to **our account code #4433** next time you are shopping at Harris Teeter.

Welcome to the Anne Arundel County Public Schools Online School Payments (OSP) portal. This service provides families the opportunity to make secure online payments for school items, fees, and activities using Visa or MasterCard. This solution is provided to a limited number of pilot schools at this time. A non-refundable 4% processing fee is added to the purchase price and paid to the software vendor for credit card fees and site maintenance. FEDERAL IMPACT PROGRAM SURVEY



Parents who are active military or who live or work on Federal Property in Maryland are asked to complete this year's Federal Impact Aid Survey when it becomes available on September 29, 2023.

You will be asked to verify your home address and identify if it is located on federal property. You will also complete sections identifying if a family member is in the military or works on federally owned property in Maryland. The survey should only take a couple of minutes to complete and, be assured, all data collected is kept completely confidential. **Why Complete This Survey**

Anne Arundel County Public Schools, like many local school districts across the United States, include within our boundaries parcels of land that are owned by the Federal Government or that have been removed from the local tax rolls by the Federal Government. Federal property is exempt from local property taxes. By submitting an application to the Department of Education each January, AACPS receives approximately \$2 million to assist in educating all our students.


