Important Reminders

Attendance: When your child is absent, please send a note stating the reason for the absence upon your child's return to school. Absences more than five days require a physician's note. When these procedures are not followed, the absence code must be assumed to be unlawful and will be coded as unexcused.

Just a few reminders about attendance:

If your child **arrives after 9:15 a.m.** they are considered tardy and **must be accompanied by a parent or responsible adult into the office to be signed in.** If coming from the dentist or doctor, please ask for a doctor's note and present it to one of the secretaries as you are signing your child in.

- If your child **leaves before 11:15 a.m.**, they are absent for the day.
- If your child leaves after 11:15 a.m., but before 1:15 p.m., they will receive an Early Dismissal with ½ day absence.
- After 1:15 p.m., Early Dismissals will be given for any student who leaves before 3:45 p.m.

Hello Shady Side Families,

We are so excited to begin our new year with our Shady Side scholars. Our schedule is as follows: Mrs. Kochanski is teaching our pre-K students, fourth graders, and fifth graders. Mrs. Wolfstone-Smith is teaching our 3rd, 2nd, 1st, and Kindergarten students. Please contact your child's Arts & Humanities teacher with any questions you may have as our year progresses. We always look forward to hearing from you.

Our first unit of exploration focuses on the concept of *Representation*. How artists represent their ideas through the arts (visual, dramatic, musical, and movement) is our foundation for this unit. Additionally, we explore, through creative challenges, how our students can represent their own ideas through various art forms. Our Driving Questions for each grade level are as follows:

- Pre-K How do we make choices that help us to learn?
- Kindergarten How can I use my imagination to create a product that represents who I am?
- 1st Grade How can exploring circles through the arts help us to understand how we are unique as individuals and as a group?
- 2nd Grade How does my family history make me unique?
- 3rd Grade How can the design and construction of a mandala represent myself, my team, and the universe?
- 4th Grade How can I create a rock mandala whose design and color reflect my personality and is a source of inspiration?
- 5th Grade How can I create a personal logo that represents my interests and aspirations?

We will continue to provide updates on this unit through this Newsletter. We look forward to working with your children and cultivating creativity and critical thinking at Shady Side Elementary!

Grades PreK- 2: These students have been learning about book care, parts of a book and how books are arranged in our Everybody section. Students are also focusing on telling the difference between fiction and nonfiction. We will continue to have read-alouds related to what the students are studying in their classes, as well as, fun stories to do with autumn and Halloween. Students love to check out books! Please help your child to remember their books on their media day so they can check out with their class.

Grades 3-5: Upper elementary students will be focusing on identifying fiction and nonfiction, as well as breaking fiction down into genres and classifying nonfiction using the Dewey Decimal Classification System. Knowing these classifications helps students find books for reading enjoyment and class research. Students are also practicing using our OPAC (Online Public Access Catalog), which can be accessed at home through ClassLink.

P.E.- Ms. Pastrana

All classes in Physical Education are off to a great start! 4th and 5th grade are just finishing their first round of fitness testing and learning how to set appropriate but challenging goals. 3rd grade has now learned the FITT principle which will help them understand how to choose the right exercises and plans to get strong or reach specific goals! 1st and 2nd grade have now learned everything there is to know about different ways to travel and move through a space safely and without bumping into anyone or anything. Pre-K and Kindergarten have been working on PE rules and procedures! Ask your kindergarteners how to do jumping jacks or explosion sit ups!

Moving forward we will be continuing fitness and health knowledge as well as entering our Kicking unit. 5th grade will learn how to apply their previous knowledge to small sided games, while 3rd and 4th are working on mastering the skill. 1st and 2nd will continuing practicing and learning how to kick with their feet safely and accurately. Our Pre-k and Kindergarten students are going to be introduced to kicking, mostly focusing on safety.

Please continue to send your students in sneakers on PE days! They will not be able to participate without safe footwear.

The students in Pre-K through 5th grade have already made some wonderful music at Shady Side this first month back! So far, the students have learned new songs, explored meter and steady beat, and performed on instruments such as hand drums, shakers, rhythm sticks, and musical spoons. 5th Graders completed their first project in our new curriculum: a musical representation of "Earth," and I was so pleased with the level of musicianship and creativity they exhibited! This month, each grade will learn some Halloween and fallthemed songs and chants. We will use this music to further develop our skills and have fun at the same time!
