Kindergarten Registration

Countywide Kindergarten Registration for the 2020-2021 school year will begin in

elementary schools during the week of April 1, 2020. Please come in to register during the hours of 9:30 a.m. - 2:30 p.m. To register your child, parents should bring the child's original birth certificate, a copy of the immunization record, and <u>TWO</u> proofs of residency (one must be a mortgage statement or rental agreement; and a current utility bill). Immunization requirements must be completed

before students attend school.

Children who live in Maryland and are five years old on or before September 1, 2020 are required to attend kindergarten and must register at their assigned school.


Out of Area Information

Out of Area Applications are accepted March 1st – May 1st. All applications should be submitted to the principal of the requested school. All incomplete applications will be returned. Applications submitted after May 1st must include documentation of a bona fide emergency or event unforeseen prior to May 1st. Applications submitted without documentation of an emergency or unforeseen event will be returned without any action being taken.


This theme explores how people process and record the human need to respond to life through the arts and literature. There are four different types of art forms:

Upcoming Classes

5th Grade

Students will learn about figural perspective and begin creating a series of artworks based on various perspectives. Students will also participate in a collaborative Mosaic Art project thanks to the support of Triple E and artist, Mrs. Vikki Keating.

4th Grade

Students will finish exploring value and practicing shading techniques through their "Erase the Face project." They will then begin studies of various animals and texture in order to make a mounted mythological creature using cellu-clay.

3rd Grade

Students will explore woven cloth and learn about the warp and weft in order to create their own circular weaving or Kente cloth.

2nd Grade

Students will create an ocean floor landscape to visually convey a foreground, middle ground and background!

1st Grade

Students will explore how art can convey meaning. They will then learn about jewelry from around the world and create their own animal pendant. They will also explore the Art and Science of sound and create their very own instrument!

Kindergarten

Students will create patterned pinch pots while exploring the detailed style of Ukrainian egg decorating as seen in the book, "Rechenka's Eggs." They will then explore painting methods to illustrate outer space through a space painting!

Pre-K

Students will continue exploring print making through a personal print journal. They will then combine the taught print types to create a print house. Then they will explore complex shapes through a series of projects.
