Principal's Message: Mrs. Melissa Brown

It's hard to believe that November is here. We have changed our clocks, begun raking leaves, and purchased our pumpkins. Many things are happening here at school as well. November brings us to the end of the first marking period, and teachers will prepare report cards to go home this month. Our musicians are continuing to learn their pieces for the Winter Concert in December, and teachers will be using 1st quarter assessment results to guide upcoming instruction. Our PTA will hold their Book Fair this month as well as a Holiday Vendor Craft Fair. We will end the month with our Thanksgiving Break.

At this point in the year, your scholars should already have established routines at home to support their learning at school. As we enter into the start of the holiday season, it can be difficult to maintain routines. Please support your students by encouraging them to continue good habits for homework completion and daily reading. Talk with your students each day about what they learned at school using open-ended questions that engage them. Review agenda books and homework to ensure your scholar is making progress. Check the Wednesday folder each week. Visit the Parent Portal to monitor your child's progress. You, as families, are an important part of the team that leads your child to success.

Continue to discuss expectations with your students. Remind them that Seagull Scholars: Persevere, Show Empathy, Show Pride, be Prepared, and Show Respect. We are working here at Shady Side to instill independence in monitoring behaviors and making appropriate choices. Ask your child to share with you what they are learning in their Guidance lessons with our School Counselor, Ms. Blandford. Also ask them to share the "Habits" they are learning from my visits to guest read to their class. I am currently reading *7 Habits of Happy* Kids by Sean Covey. All students have been introduced to the first 2 Habits: You are in Charge (of the choices you make) and Have a Plan. We are in the middle of the visits for Habit 3: Work First, Then Play. Your child should be able to tell you how these habits will help them in their lives.

Thanksgiving might still be a few weeks away, but I wanted to take this opportunity to say Thank You to all of our Shady Side Families. Thank you for the welcome Mrs. Williams and I have received as we joined the Shady Side family. Thank you for the support you show our school. Thank you for sharing your wonderful children with us each day. We are grateful for all that you do.

Quarterly Award Recognition Changes

Working with the faculty here at Shady Side Elementary, we have made a few changes to our quarterly awards.

Principals' Honor Roll and Honor Roll have been revised to be more aligned with the secondary level.

Principals' Honor Roll – All A's and All CD's in content areas (cannot have EM or ND in Expected Student Behaviors)

Honor Roll – All A's and B's, can have one C as long as there is at least one A, no EM's or ND's in any area

Attendance awards have been revised to be able to recognize those students who have only missed one day and are so close to perfect. We have added an exceptional attendance category and refined perfect to truly reflect perfect attendance.

Perfect Attendance – Perfect is perfect: no absences, no tardies, no early dismissals. Students missed no instruction.

Exceptional Attendance – Given to students with no more than 1 absence and no more than 2 tardies/early dismissals.

All grades: It's that time of year: Book Fair time! Students in all grades will be viewing a preview of books available to them at the Book Fair. We will try to add many of these titles to our library collection so they can check out what they aren't able to purchase. The Book Fair will run Monday, November 18- Friday, November 22. Students will visit the Book Fair on their Media day.

Grades K- 2: These students have been learning about parts of a book, award-winning books and locating books in the media center using call numbers. We are especially enjoying sharing books about autumn, Halloween and Thanksgiving!

Grades 3-5: Upper elementary students have been focusing on using books for research- how to find the correct source and the information we need. Also, we have been looking at what criteria we use to choose a book to read for personal enjoyment.

Music - Mrs. Witmer

Students in all grade levels have been working on various musical skills. Our Pre-K, Kindergarten and 1st Graders have done activities with singing voice development, steady beat movement, and echoing and improvising tonal or rhythm patterns. 2nd grade will play some singing games and explore "Call and Response" form. 3rd and 4th grade will be singing in harmony and playing melodic instruments such as xylophones and boomwhackers. 5th Graders just finished their second project in which they chose a pop song and created a visual "Listening Map" to illustrate the form and various musical elements. Some of these Listening Maps will adorn the walls outside the music room so others can see their work!

This month, many of our 5th Grade Chorus students will participate in our annual, "Southern Sings" Feeder System Choral Festival. They are working to prepare three pieces, which they will rehearse and later perform with singers from Lothian, Tracey's, Deale, Southern Middle and Southern High School on Wednesday, November 13th!

All student rubrics are in the gradebook throughout the marking period. Please email me at the start of each lesson if you would like a copy in advance.

All 3rd-5th grade students will continue using artistic journals.

5th: Students will continue making symbolic stamps and prints, then begin storytelling through a series of artworks.

4th: Students will create artwork in the style of Mexican Hojalata (tin) art.

3rd: Students will participate in a collaborative artwork in the theme of, "we're better together." They will also use symbolism to create a map of their journey to school.

2nd: Students will create continuous line drawings in the art style of Alexander Calder's mobile sculptures.

1st: Students will explore the theme of connection, learning an example of a Northwest pacific coast Indian style of art making and will explore artistic problem solving through various paper making media.

Kindergarten: Students will create self-portraits, then they will explore movement in artmaking.

Pre-K: Students will begin exploration of colors and color mixing through a "Mouse Paint" themed artwork. They will then learn painting rules and create their very own Mondrian inspired painting! Upcoming Events: Deale Library display-Month of November starting on the 5th.
