Principal's Message: Happy April! Spring is in full swing, and teachers are enjoying all the ways they are seeing students learn and grow. By now, we have adjusted nicely to the new times and routines of Hybrid Learning. We are so proud of all of our students, both those in person and those remaining virtual. Some students changed teachers, everyone adjusted to new times as we follow our school hours, and our intermediate students no longer have their subjects departmentalized. Through it all, students have been cooperative and made up proud. This month presents us with Easter/Spring Break, Superhero Day, Picture Day, the end of the 3rd Marking Period and Report Cards. The year seems to be flying by, but we still have a great deal to accomplish as we prepare your students for the next grade level.

I cannot encourage you enough, whenever your child is virtual, to ensure they are *completing their own work*! In order to be prepared for a hopeful return to a more normal school experience next year, where students will not have someone sitting right next to them, it is important for teachers to truly know what students are able to do independently. Teachers look at all work as data upon which they make instructional decisions. In order to provide your students with the best support and extension to help them master standards, we need to have a true picture of strengths and weaknesses. We know you know how to do PK-5th grade work; we need to see how your students do. Independence with assignments is not the only area we would like to foster independence. We have seen amazing things from even our youngest learners in terms of logging on and navigating their technology by themselves, without adult assistance. At this point in the year, all students should be able to do so. The more you provide opportunities for independence, the more your students will "wow" all of us with what they can accomplish.

As we navigate through April, I may not be in the building, but I will certainly be getting regular updates about the happenings at Shady Side Elementary. I look forward to hearing great things. Continue to reinforce expectations, ensure your child has their materials prepared every day, provide a dedicated workspace that maximizes the learning environment, share story time with your child each day whether they read, or you read to them, hold them accountable for their work, and encourage your students to be their best.

Curtis John Pride is a former Major League Baseball outfielder who is deaf. He batted left-handed and threw right-handed. In 2015, Pride was named MLB's Ambassador for Inclusion, Since 2009 Pride has served as the

head baseball coach at Gallaudet University.






Marlee Beth Matlin is an American actress, author. and activist. She won the Academy Award for Best Actress for Children of a Lesser God and to date is the only deaf performer to have won an Academy Award. Having won the award at the age of 21, she is also the youngest winner in the category.





Heather Leigh Whitestone McCallum is a former beauty queen and conservative activist who was the first deaf Miss America title holder, having lost most of her hearing at age 18 months.





Andrew Jackson Foster was a missionary to the deaf in Ghana. Rwanda and other countries in Africa from 1956 until his death in 1987. In 1954, he became the first Deaf African American to earn a bachelor's degree from Gallaudet University and the first to earn a master's degree from Eastern Michigan University.

Chuck Baird was an

American Deaf artist who was one of the more



Claudia L. Gordon is the first deaf Black female attorney in the United States. She currently works in the U.S. Department of Labor's Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs.



George William Veditz was a former president of National Association of the Deaf of the United States and was one of the first to film American Sign Language.



notable founders of the De'VIA art movement, an aesthetic of Deaf Culture in which visual art conveys a Deaf world view. His career spanned over 35 Irving King Jordan years and included painting, sculpting, acting, storytelling, and teaching.



Nyle DiMarco is an American model, actor, and deaf activist. In 2015, DiMarco was the winner of The CW's reality television series America's Next Top Model in season 22, becoming the second male winner and the first deaf winner.



Derrick Lamont Coleman is a former American football fullback. He was signed as an undrafted free agent by the Minnesota Vikings in 2012. He played college football for the University of California, Los Angeles. Coleman is the first legally deaf offensive player in the NFL.



became the first deaf president of Gallaudet University in 1988 after Deaf President Now. Gallaudet is the world's only university with all programs and services designed specifically for deaf and hard-of-hearing students.



Music News — Mrs. Witmer ~ Happy Spring, Shady Side families! This month will be full of new music making and learning in all grade levels. In Kindergarten, we will sing, move, and play songs with the pitches "So, Mi and La." First grade will explore melodic contour through singing, moving, and composing. Second grade will explore the tone color of various classroom percussion instruments through listening and playing virtual instruments. In Third grade, we will learn about Brass instruments and their unique timbre. Fourth grade students will study both male and female voice types. Our 5th grade students have begun a new project where they will research and design a virtual "Baseball Card" about a Music Career of their choice.

A quick note: as we near the end of the 3rd Quarter, please be sure to check your child's "Missing" assignment in Google Classroom. Anything from the 3rd quarter can be turned in without penalty through the last day, which is April 14th.

In Chorus this month, we will begin working on our song for our "Virtual Performance" at the end of the school year. If your child is enrolled in Chorus, please ensure they attend our weekly Meets. We meet for just 25 minutes per week: either Monday at 1:40 p.m. or Friday at 1:40 p.m., depending on which group they are enrolled in.

Art News – Miss Shryock – Happy Spring SSES artists and families! Hybrid friends: Please remember to bring art materials to school if you happened to have art the day you are in the building. You can check the Weekly Work Menu in Google Classroom to see what you will need for the following class as well as review lessons if you are ever absent. Keep working hard and being a good artist!

Instrumental News — Dr. Orr - Instrumental musicians spring into April by exploring the many facets of music. The Advanced Band will explore musical concepts including the staccato, D.S.al fine, D.C.al Fine, and largo. Additionally, they will learn about the life and times of Verdi, Beethoven, Handel, Clarke, and Sibelius. The Beginning Band will play their first choral, "First Choral" and explore the musical concepts of ritardando, pick-up notes and fermata. The Beginning Band can look forward to discovering the life and times of Mozart and Billings. The Beginning Orchestra began the bow and will add notes on the fingerboard. They will continue to practice proper bow placement, reinforcing of the bow hold. Additionally, they will explore the G and D down tetrachords. The Intermediate Orchestra will discover theme and variation, ensemble pieces including "Spring," dotted half notes and the techniques for using different parts of the bow. Additionally, they will explore the life and times of Dvorak, Vivaldi, and Offenbach, Finally, the Advanced Orchestra will dive into staccato notes, slurs, and the 4th finger "E" on the "A" string. They will explore the life and times of Sibelius. The band and orchestra are ready to spring into action.



PC News — Mrs. Bacon ~ Happy April! I love when the weather starts warming up because it means more opportunities to go outside and play! Please continue to encourage your child(ren) to get outside and move. Our students should be getting 60 minutes of physical activity each day! During this past year, it's normal that our activities levels have decreased, however, it's time to turn that around! Our kiddos need to get up and moving! To encourage more movement and activity during PE this month we will be reviewing our catching skills! Primary students will review skills we touched on earlier this year and intermediate students will practice their juggling! Once we finish that unit, we will all jump into Cardio Drumming! We have been having so much fun during PE this year. Please make sure your child(ren) have enough space to move in their learning area if possible and are up and ready for PE.

As spring makes its presence known, our students continue to explore topics that bring knowledge, inspiration, and creative opportunities.

PreK students are beginning a unit called Let's Make Some Noise. Kindergarten students will continue the Trees are Terrific Unit. We enjoyed our Google Meet with an Arlington Echo tree expert where we learned how to plant a tree and what a tree needs to survive. We even got to look at a video highlighting the trees at our school. Please have your children share their tree journals and tell you all they have learned about trees.

Mrs. K's first graders will explore improvisation and object puppetry. Mrs. W-S's first graders are exploring the idea of creating your own special garden. For this unit, students are asked to have paper, markers, crayons (or paints!), glue, and a pencil ready to use each week. Each week, students will be adding to their garden artwork, so it is important to have these materials available each week.

Second graders, third graders, and fifth graders will continue the Self-care unit. They are learning and creating strategies that will help them keep a healthy body and mind.
