## Our Student Early Dismissal School Policy

When you wish to have your child dismissed early from school, please send a note so that the teacher and the office staff are aware of the arrangements When emailing the teacher please add <a href="mailto:image


Parents can be most helpful by not calling the school for daily changes. Please confirm arrangements with your child prior to your child's departure from home in the morning.

To facilitate a safe and orderly dismissal for all students we will not be able to grant early dismissal to parents arriving after 2:00 p.m.

Southgate Elementary School is equipped with a video camera system. It covers selected interior and exterior public portions of the building and grounds. It is NOT monitored constantly, but it is monitored during emergency situations. During certain events, when the safety or security of students may be in question, authorized personnel from local, state, or federal police or fire emergency units may be given access to view images projected on the camera system. If you have any questions about the system, you should call the Supervisor of School Security at 410-222-5083."





### The 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline

Marylanders have a new way to connect to a local behavioral health crisis call specialist. Calling 988 connects callers directly to the National Suicide & Crisis. Lifeline which can provide assistance with substance use or mental health crises.

### What does this mean for Marylanders?

When someone in Maryland calls 988, the call is routed based on the caller's area code. For those calls routed to Maryland, the call is answered by one of the eight strategically-located call centers. These centers provide phone-based support and information regarding local resources.

Maryland has been operating its own crisis hotline (call 211, press 1) which will remain in operation and accessible to Marylanders throughout the transition period and beyond.

### Who can call 988?

Anyone in need of assistance with behavioral health-related problems.

### What can callers expect when they call 988?

Callers will hear a greeting message while their call is routed to a Lifeline network crisis call center (based on the caller's area code)

 A trained crisis counselor will answer the phone, listen to the caller, understand how their problem is affecting them, provide support, and provide resources and interventions as needed

- If a Maryland crisis center is unable to take the call, the caller will be automatically routed to a national backup crisis center
- The Lifeline provides live crisis center phone services in English and Spanish and uses Language Line Solutions to provide translation services in one 15% additional languages for records who call 988.
- services in over 150 additional languages for people who call 988
   Veterans can access the Veterans Crisis Line by calling 988 and pressing 1

### What can someone expect during a chat or text?

- Texts and chats to 988 will also be routed to a Lifeline network crisis call center based on area code.
- . A response to chats and texts will be given by a call center staff person



AFTER YOU CLICK "SUBMIT" ON THE INITIAL APPLICATION PAGE, AN EMAIL WILL BE SENT TO YOU FROM "Screen ID" ALLOWING YOU TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION PROCESS.

Background checks are good for two years. To avoid having to resubmit your background check every two years, you can opt to be fingerprinted. This remains valid as long as you have a child enrolled in AAPCS. Overnight field trips and Drownproofing require volunteers to be fingerprinted.

Fingerprint-supported background checks must be scheduled through the Fingerprinting Office at 410-222-5045. The Fingerprinting Office is located at the AACPS Central Office on Riva Road and is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, and 8 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. on Wednesdays, during the school year. The cost of fingerprinting is \$63.00, and it includes the commercial background check. Fingerprint-supported background checks for chaperones should be completed at least 3 weeks prior to the scheduled field trip.

Please note the background checks and fingerprinting must be completed at least three weeks prior to a scheduled field trip or school visit to allow time for processing.
