WAUGH CHAPEL REDO POLICY

Anne Arundel County Public Schools has a redo policy. While some of it is mandated, certain aspects are left up to the individual school. Waugh Chapel has worked together to create a cohesive policy that will support us this school year. We are hoping that by clearly defining our redo policy we can better assist families in working with students. Please read and familiarize yourselves with the redo policy below:

- Students, in grades 1-5, shall have **three** additional opportunities to improve <u>a score of</u> <u>69% or less</u> on a qualifying weekly test, quiz, cluster test, activity, or assignment which demonstrates knowledge of course content, skills, and standards.
- The *three* assignments can be in any content area, but it is limited to three total for the marking period. For example, the student can redo an assignment in math and two in reading if that is what they choose to do.
- After a redo is completed, the higher of the two grades will be entered in the gradebook and will count towards calculation of the final grade for that quarter. The redo can only happen one time for that individual assignment. For example, if the students does the assignment, but is still not successful, it cannot be redone again. However, the higher grade will be used and reteaching will still continue.
- To qualify, students must have completed and submitted the original assessment, activity, or assignment by the due date and must have participated in the teacher-facilitated reteaching within 10 school days following the return of the original graded work by the teacher to the student. A redo does not necessarily have to reflect the structure of the initial test, but rather the skill(s) that were taught.
- At the end of the marking period, there may not be ten days left to complete a redo. Therefore, no redos will take place within the last 5 school days before the end of the marking period.
- Assignments and tests given in the last 5 school days before the end of the marking period are not eligible for a redo.
- Work that may not be reassessed includes skill assessments/benchmarks, final research reports and projects that culminate a unit of study or end of the marking period exam.
- *Redo's must be done in school, not at home.*
- There is no re-do policy for assignments or assessments completed in Media, Music, *Physical Education, or Art.*

This policy is currently effective and, therefore, applies to any weekly test, quiz, cluster test, activity, or assignment taken from this point forward.
