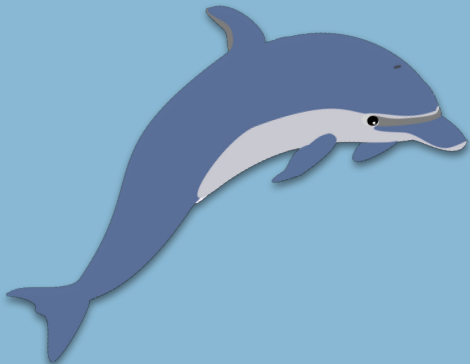

COVID Information



All students will be required to wear masks on our buses, in classrooms, hallways, and at indoor recess.

Students will be allowed to remove their masks while eating and drinking, engaging in strenuous activities and playing outside.

Students are recommended to remain home for any of the following symptoms:

- fever of 100.4 or higher
- cough
- diarrhea or vomiting
- new loss of taste or smell
- sore throat
- difficulty breathing
- new onset of severe headache

COVID Information



What is the definition of a close contact?

With some limited exceptions, those determined to have been within 6 feet of the COVID-positive person for 15 total minutes over a 24-hour period.

When must a close contact quarantine?

Close contacts who are unable to be vaccinated or who have not been vaccinated must quarantine for 10 days. In Anne Arundel County Public Schools, the quarantine period may not be shortened by a negative test.

When is a close contact excluded from quarantine?

If a close contact is fully vaccinated for more than 14 days and is asymptomatic, that person does not have to quarantine.



Communication and Assistance
