Arundel High School is a diverse, comprehensive high school with a tradition that once served an agricultural community dating back to 1950. It is now nestled within the technology triangle between Baltimore, Annapolis and Washington, D.C. Arundel's pride is seen in academics, athletics, and extra-curricular activities that inspire over 1,900 students each year. Our students come from various backgrounds, some from other countries, while many other students attend the

Alma Mater of their parents and grandparents. Arundel is always changing and yet full of deep community traditions with a reputation of having a school culture with positive relationships that really drives the work of the entire school community. For several years, much effort has focused on strategies to help all students feel at home in our school. In order to provide an academic program that prepares all students for college and career, resources were invested in the Career Technology Education program. In addition to the traditional college completer diploma pathway, six career completers are offered: Business Management, Career Research and Development, Food and Beverage Management, Early Childhood, Construction Design and Management, and Information Technology Software Computer Science. Many students are excited to have the opportunity to earn dual completer status by preparing for college while developing marketable career skills.

Signature Program

The goal of Arundel Signature Program is to create PASSIONATE and ENGAGED future workers to the 21st Century Global Community. By working with several of the



community's finest "field professionals" we provide students with life changing experiences that will help them explore various career sectors. Community Development and Global Citizenship is problem solving to ensure equitible and sustainable solution that benfit every member of diverse communities with an awareness of how each individual and community contributes to our global society.

The Arundel Signature Program considers issues, events, and essential questions relevant to youth, discusses the cultural and technological influences that shape our modern society, and understand the impact of social and professional option on the future. AVID

AVID is an academic, elective program designed to provide support to students who are in the "academic middle." AVID prepares students to enter and be successful in college through career and college exploration.

During each AVID class, students receive instruction in: reading/writing across the curriculum, note and test-taking strategies, study skills, organization and time management.

Career Completer Programs

Construction and Design Management is a four credit career completer program offered exclusively to Arundel High School students. This program looks at community development through the structures and buildings that make up our neighborhoods and commercial spaces. Students explore all stages of the design and construction process using Autodesk engineering and architectual tools, Auto CAD and Rivit Architecture. Students will develop a design portfolio and have the opportunity to earn industry certification in Auto CAD.

Business Management is a three credit career completer program offered at Arundel High School with an extension provided on our campus from Anne Arundel Community College. Students will develop a business plan an apply accounting, marketing, and management concepts to realistic business scenarios. Students will access work study, mentorship, internship, and job shadowing opportunities. Successful students can apply to the National Business Honor Society.
