

A message from your principal!

I hope that your family enjoyed the Thanksgiving Break and that you are rested and ready for the short journey to the next break. With just three weeks until our Christmas/Winter Holiday break, there's a lot happening at school to share with you! We are now settled into the 2nd Marking Period and you can expect to see interims come home on Friday, December 13th.


With many grade levels scheduling field trips this fall/winter, this is a great time to complete your background check, just so it's on file and ready to go should you be selected as a chaperone. Here's the link to the chaperone page on the AACPS website. Note, most field trips require only the second option, a Commercial Background Check, and not the Fingerprint Supported Background check. Also, it is important to know that for security reasons, AACPS does not allow parents of family members to meet at field trip site. All adults attending the field trip must be identified as trip chaperones and have completed background checks.

Recently I was struck by an article circulating on social media entitled "The 'Million Word Gap' for children who aren't read to at home" which highlights the importance of reading to and with young children. In summary, the article noted: "Young children whose parents read them five books a day enter kindergarten having heard about 1.4 million more words than kids who were never read to, a new study found. This 'million word gap' could be one key in explaining differences in vocabulary and reading development." As I continue to consider this article, I urge you to dust off that library card, pack up your kids, and run to the local library. Grab as many books as you can and start a family tradition of reading together every day!

As we look to the future of Monarch Academy Annapolis, we are excited to be rolling out unique programming and awesome experiences that set our school apart from all the rest. Attached to this email you will find a flyer explaining the work we are doing to expand our Gifted and Talented Pathways here at Monarch Annapolis. Our plans in this area have three prongs: 1) expanded identification to represent ALL learners, 2) expanded curriculum resources and strategies, some stand-alone and some embedded in the PYP units, and 3) parent involvement and development to support giftedness in children. This expansion means we will provide what AACPS does and MORE. We plan to kick off parent committees in this area in the new year and hope you will be a part of it. This is just one of several components of our vision for our future here at Monarch Annapolis. Stay tuned for more information!

Gratitude is one of the many positive emotions we teach kids at Monarch Annapolis. It can be explained with this definition: pausing to take notice and appreciate the things we have (things we often take for granted).

There are also so many <u>amazing books</u> about gratitude. A favorite is *Those*Shoes by Maribeth Boelts. You can find a <u>read aloud</u> of this book on Youtube.

Reading Updates

Did you know that when students increase their reading by just 5 extra minutes a day, for two months, they will read approximately 45,667 words, increase their fluency by 5-7 words per minute, and score higher on reading assessments? The Reading Team is kicking off the season with a school-wide reading incentive called "Take 5 by the Fireside". Students in all classes will participate in finding 5 minutes every day to stop and read for fun in front of a virtual fireplace. Classes will keep a chart of their total minutes. Every class who reads a total of 3,500+ minutes between December 2nd and January 31st will enjoy a celebration with s'mores.

We are looking forward to some cozy reading time as the weather gets cooler!
