COOLING DOWN

Meltdowns with De-Escalation

Meltdowns are stressful for anyone involved. They may seem unpredictable but usually there is a clear pattern for the before, during and after. Some call this "The Escalation Cycle." Knowing this about your child can help prevent some of those nasty meltdowns.

De-Escalation Strategies

- \diamond Do not try to reason with them
- \diamond Do not yell over top of a screaming child
- \diamond Validate their feelings not their actions
- \Diamond $\hfill Be aware of your body language / facial expressions$
- ♦ Silence
- \diamond Movement break or a walk
- ♦ Distraction
- ♦ Deep breathing exercises



Cool Down Corners

Zen Zone, Antarctica, Calming Corner. Regardless of the name, they are a great tool for kids and adults. They look a little different in each classroom but can be used at home too! A cool down corner should be a safe, comfy space to sit in and process your emotions.

6 Healthy Habits to Stay Healthy in the Winter

Get Vaccinated- it's the most effective way to stop the flu.

Wash Your Hands Frequently- at least 5 times a day for 20 seconds- it is the most effective way to stop the spread of germs.

Assessment at Monarch

As February arrives, it is important to realize students have completed over one half of the school year. Over the next few months, many of our students will be completing different county and state assessments. Students in grades 1 - 5 will be completing the AACPS county math assessments for their grade at the end of the third quarter. Students in grades 1 - 5 will also complete the end of year testing for i Ready. Grade 5 students will be completing the Maryland Integrated Science Assessment (MISA) in March. This assessment allows students to show the Science knowledge they have learned while in elementary school. From early April until early June, students in grades 3, 4, and 5 will complete the Maryland Comprehensive Assessment Program (MCAP). This assessment replaces PARCC, which was used administered the past several years. MCAP will assess students in Math and Language Arts. Letters will be sent home to families of students taking MISA and MCAP that will provide more information and the exact testing dates.

It is very important that students attend school on their testing days and work hard to do their best. The assessments allow students to show what they have learned throughout the year. Our students have worked hard all year and these assessments all them to show what they have learned.
