
Factors Driving Reopening Official Guidance

Vaccinations are independent of school reopening











Social distancing plans during student/staff travel Desks in classrooms appropriately spaced and/or marked

Custodial staff trained to appropriately clean buildings





School front offices will have protective acrylic guards

Bus routes result in no more than one student facing forward in every seat for social distancing


8-11 Teachers and Support Group personnel for small-group instruction at Centers of Applied Technology and Developmental Centers


Return of Hybrid Students The School Day




