AVAILABLE METHODS OF RECORDING LESSONS

Method 1: The preferred method of recording live teaching during the instructional learning blocks, with students' microphones and cameras turned on. This can take place only when all students in a classroom have audio and video permissions.

Method 2: Recording only the teacher's image during the introduction of the core instructional concepts or a summary of the lesson at the end of the class period using <u>Spotlight Mode</u> on the teacher, with all students' microphones muted. This recording will last a short time (maybe 5 to 7 minutes). During the rest of the class, students will have cameras and microphones on so they can interact with the teacher.

Method 3: Pre-recording the introduction of the core instructional concepts or a summary of the lesson for students to access asynchronously. This recording will last a short time (maybe 5 to 7 minutes). Real-time instruction will not be recorded, thus allowing for full interaction between teachers and students during class time. Pre-Recorded lessons cannot take the place of real-time instruction.
