





Elementary Schools

Students should be at least 3 feet apart in classrooms where everyone is masked, regardless of level of community transmission





Secondary Schools

Students should be at least 3 feet apart in classrooms where everyone is masked where transmission is low, moderate, or substantial.

OR





Secondary Schools

Students should be at least 6 feet apart in classrooms where everyone is masked where transmission is high—if cohorting is not possible.





Secondary Schools


Cohorting:

"When groups of students are kept together with the same peers and staff throughout the school day to reduce the risk for spread throughout the school."

CDC continues to recommend at least 6 feet of distance:

 between adults in the school building and between adults and students.





CDC continues to recommend at least 6 feet of distance:

 when masks can't be worn, such as when eating.





No changes to bus capacity per CDC, MSDE









If Contact Tracing radius is 3 feet:








Contact Tracing

If Contact Tracing radius is 6 feet:








Contact Tracing

Key Points & Concerns



- 3 feet distancing for ES; MS and HS are recommended to remain at 6 feet
- 3 feet distancing pertains to only within classroom; no change to distancing on buses or throughout the school
- 6 feet distancing when eating




Key Points & Concerns



- No change to contact tracing protocols (increased number of quarantines)
- Ability of FNS staff to maintain current meal service
- Student supervision for midday block
- Instructional staff accommodations
