An agreed upon process should be communicated to all schools in writing before the season starts. End of season communications and/or a meeting (in-person or virtual) should be used to implement the agreed upon process.

- a. AACPS Athletics does not sponsor or provide oversight for the Coaches All-County selection process.
- b. Sport Commissioners may help to facilitate the date, time, and location of an end-of-season meeting for this purpose. They may attend for note taking, questions, and general support. However, they will not lead, control, or provide oversight on the process.

<u>Contests</u>

- <u>Scrimmages</u>:
 - 3 preseason scrimmages allowed
 - Teams are allowed one postseason scrimmage (in between last game and first playoff game)
- <u>MPSSAA Season Limitations:</u>
 - o 12 regular season games or 14 with designated optional tournament;
 - o No more than two games per week;
 - o Three games in one week may be scheduled twice during the season; and
 - o A team may elect to play in one designated optional two-game tournament.
 - o JV contests that end in a tie after regulation will play one traditional overtime period 10 minutes with sudden victory. If the game is still tied it will remain a tie.
- AACPS Scheduling Scheme:
 - The base county schedule provides all schools with 6 base county games, 2 Howard County games and 3 county championship play-in games.
 - O County Championship play-in games:

Teams have been placed in a 3-game, 16-line consolation bracket (see below), based on combined boys and girls results from base county scheduled games over the past two seasons (2022 and 2023).

- 1-BN, 2-SP, 3-SR, 4-SO, 5-NC, 6-AR, 7-CR, 8-CH, 9-OM, 10-AN, 11-NE, 12-GB, 13-ME
- In the 1st round three teams will have a bye and will be able to fill that game on their own (an additional "pick-up" game for those schools).
- In the 2nd round three different teams will have a bye. Two of those teams may play in a "special" game that will not impact the 3rd round matchups but will give them a game. One team will be left out. A fair procedure will be established for determining which schools play in that special game.
- In the 3rd round two of the byes will create one of the matchups, resulting in one new team not having an opponent.
- Therefore, throughout the 3-game tournament two different teams will have a game that won't be filled. This is because AACPS currently has an odd number of schools for lacrosse (13).
- The "winners" side of the bracket will result in the varsity county championship matchup.
- Junior Varsity

- o Junior varsity teams will "follow" their varsity team, playing the same three matchups regardless of junior varsity results.
- o The matchup for the junior varsity county championship game will be determined separately, based on the criteria in the AACPS Athletics Handbook. The county championship play-in games will be included in this calculation.
 - Games not played due to a scheduled BYE, or when the scheduled opponent does not field a team will be considered a "no game" for the existing team (no impact on wins or losses).
- o Athletics, in consultation with sport commissioners and ADs, reserves the right to make adjustments to the JV schedule in order to address participation and meet the needs of the overall program (example: the loss of JV programs).
- <u>AACPS Contest Procedures:</u>
 - JV-Varisty Girls and Boys double headers in early week games at 5:00 and 6:30 pm at all sites
 - Varsity double header on Fridays with Girls at 5:00 and Boys at 7:00; and with JV at opposites sites at 4:45 pm the preceding Thursday
 - Contest structure and timing for boys and girls lacrosse will follow current NFHS guidelines unless otherwise communicated by AACPS.
 - Each school's location in the county, transportation services, and facility situations are different. With that in mind, for away games schools may - at their discretion with admin approval - leave school early to ensure they arrive in time to get to the field and warmup. In those cases, efforts should be made to minimize the disruption and impact on academic time as much as possible.
 - <u>Music</u>. Visiting teams are not permitted to play music with portable/rolling speakers or other devices while visiting away sites.

Notes:

* All schools must participate in all 3 rounds.

* 1st round matchups will be based on previous years' AACPS base county records.

* Where feasible, first round matchups will be against schools not played during the regular season.

* In the event of byes, the consolation bracket matchups will be arranged such that the byes matchup in the end if at all possible.

* JV will follow varsity for the 3 rounds of this tournament. The county championship matchup for JV will be determined separately, based on our traditional procedures (handbook).

• A special game will be played in the 2nd round between the teams in games 13 and 16 to eliminate what would be a lost game because of the bye. This special game will have no impact on the next round.

County Championship and Awards

- There will be no in-season county champion
- The top two teams from the regular season will play for the County Championship at Glen Burnie High School on May 6th (as described above). The play-in games for JV where they "follow" their varsity (also described above) will count towards their record for this purpose.
- If tied at the end of regulation, play OT periods until a winner is determined
- Awards: 35 medals per team, County Championship game plaque, and Head Coach Plaque
- JV County Championship criteria: A JV player is eligible to participate so long as they have entered no more than two regular season varsity contests (excluding tournaments – they may also play in varsity tournaments)

MPSSAA Playoffs

Note - Every MPSSAA school is automatically entered into the region tournament unless the MPSSAA office receives written notification to the contrary. All schools must adhere to the MPSSAA bulletin.

- **Point of Emphasis**: Egregious Ejections: Any ejection during the state tournament that is classified as egregious now results in a two-game suspension. The MPSSAA has established criteria based on definitions of egregious behavior that will be used during the regional and state tournaments to elevate any ejections under this category to a minimum of two contest disqualification from the current state tournament, next sport season, or the succeeding year's tournament based on the circumstances of the situation (Example of student whose team loses the first round of the next season. Egregious behavior is being defined as:
 - Fighting
 - Physical or verbal personal attacks directed towards an official, coach, student-athlete, spectator, or school personnel
 - Use of racial, ethnic, homophobic or other derogatory or discriminatory language, slurs or practices.
