An agreed upon process should be communicated to all schools in writing before the season starts. End of season communications and/or a meeting (in-person or virtual) should be used to implement the agreed upon process.

- a. AACPS Athletics does not sponsor or provide oversight for the Coaches All-County selection process.
- b. Sport Commissioners may help to facilitate the date, time, and location of an end-of-season meeting for this purpose. They may attend for note taking, questions, and general support. However, they will not lead, control, or provide oversight on the process.

<u>Contests</u>

- <u>Scrimmages</u>:
 - o 3 preseason scrimmages allowed
 - o Teams are allowed one postseason scrimmage (in between last game and first playoff game)
- <u>MPSSAA Season Limitations:</u>
 - o 18 contests or 20 with designated optional tournament;
 - o No more than three games per week;

- o A team may elect to play in a designated optional three-game tournament, only 17 regular season games may be scheduled; and
- o If a team elects to play in the designated optional two or three-game tournament, a fourth game may be played during that week
- AACPS Scheduling Scheme:
 - The base county schedule provides all schools with 13 or 14 games. Each school plays every other school once and has 1 or 2 additional crossover games.
- <u>AACPS Contest Procedures:</u>
 - o AACPS county games are scheduled to start at 4:45 pm.
 - When possible, JV contests that end in a tie after regulation will play extra innings until a winner is determined.
 - In alignment with the MPSSAA bulletin, each team will be given a minimum of 20 minutes of on-field warmup time, with the home team typically going first and the visiting team typically going second. The visiting team's on-field warmup should end by 4:40, to allow time for the pregame meeting at the plate and any other logistics. Teams may use their 20 minutes how they see fit.
 - Each school's location in the county, transportation services, and facility situations are different. With that in mind, for away games schools may - at their discretion with admin approval - leave school early to ensure they arrive in time to get to the field and warmup. In those cases, efforts should be made to minimize the disruption and impact on academic time as much as possible.
 - <u>Who can be in the dugout?</u> Only contracted coaches, student-athletes, and designated team managers can be in the dugout. Parents/spectators who are assisting with scorekeeping or other volunteer activities must be positioned outside the dugout area.
 - <u>Music</u>. Visiting teams are not permitted to play music with portable/rolling speakers or other devices while visiting away sites.
 - o <u>Darkness/Weather/Postponements</u>
 - Officials may end games due to darkness. In those cases, we will use the NFHS rules, as stated here. Due to the nature of our schedules, we will not bring schools back together to finish games that have met these rule standards.
 - Softball NFHS Rule 4-2 Art. 2: If a game ends because of weather conditions, or darkness interferes with play so that the game is called (ended) by the umpire, it is a regulation game provided: a) five full innings have been played; or if the home team has scored an equal or greater number of runs in four or four and a fraction turns at bat than the visiting team has scored in five turns. b) play has gone beyond five full innings and is called when the teams have not had an equal number of completed turns at bat. The score shall be the same as it was at the end of the last completed inning; unless the home team, in its half of the incomplete inning, scores a run (or runs) which equals or exceeds the opponent's score, in which case the final score shall be as recorded when the game is called.
 - Incomplete contests postponed due to weather should be made up the following day whenever possible. Specifically, such postponed contests take precedence over any other preemptive plans for adjustments to future contests schools may be considering.

County Championship and Awards

- An in-season county champion will be determined per the guidelines in our handbook on page 78.
- The top two teams from the regular season based on the results of the 12 games identified on the schedule that is maintained by the sport commissioner will play for the County Championship at Bachman on May 7th. Handbook criteria will be used for tie breaks as needed.
- 25 medals per varsity team, County Championship game plaque/Head Coach Plaque
- If tied at the end of seven innings, play extra innings until a winner is determined
- JV County Championship criteria: A JV player is eligible to participate so long as they have entered no more than two regular season varsity contests (excluding tournaments – they may also play in varsity tournaments)

MPSSAA Playoffs

Note - Every MPSSAA school is automatically entered into the region tournament unless the MPSSAA office receives written notification to the contrary. All schools must adhere to the MPSSAA bulletin.

- Point of Emphasis: Egregious Ejections: Any ejection during the state tournament that is classified as egregious now results in a two-game suspension. The MPSSAA has established criteria based on definitions of egregious behavior that will be used during the regional and state tournaments to elevate any ejections under this category to a minimum of two contest disqualification from the current state tournament, next sport season, or the succeeding year's tournament based on the circumstances of the situation (Example of student whose team loses the first round of the next season. Egregious behavior is being defined as:
 - Fighting
 - Physical or verbal personal attacks directed towards an official, coach, student-athlete, spectator, or school personnel
 - Use of racial, ethnic, homophobic or other derogatory or discriminatory language, slurs or practices.
